**RUMORS OF ANOTHER DEAL IN MONETA MINES**

The following is from the current issue of the Hamilton B. Wills & Co. Market Despatch:—  
Following a three-point advance in Moneta this week, rumors of a deal being negotiated for this 120 acres directly adjoining Hollinger Consolidated on the west are heard, and, as buying now on is reported as coming from the same source as accumulated large holdings in Schumacher before the deal with Hollinger was announced, it would seem there is something in it.  
For a long time it has been reported in Porcupine that underground development on the Blue Quartz Vein of the Hollinger system had been carried along successfully up to the Moneta boundary and such being the case it is the opinion of well-posted mining men, this company is the most logical purchaser of the Moneta property. The accumulation of this stock is being carried along quietly, just as in the case of Schumacher and a gradual advance is looked for. Mining men argue if the Schumacher 160 acres are worth \$1,650,000, the Moneta 120 acres, also well situated are worth approximately \$750,000, or 35 cents a share. Current prices are around 13 cents.
