FALLS DEFEATED, 4 TO 3, BY COCHRANE BALL TEAM

At the end of the sixth, the score was 3 to 1, in favour of the Falls, in the seventh innings Cochrane added a second run to the score. In the eighth, Cochrane got two more runs on a wild throw to second, with two men out. Pine, who pitched for the Falls struck out 15 men. Campbell pitched a good game for Cochrane, Thacker being in right field.

A meeting was called for next Thursday at the Dome at 4.30 p.m. to prepare another schedule.

The Goodyear Cup competition next came up for discussion. The only teams entered for this are Kirkland,

Dome and Timmins. It was decided to draw for the first game, the winners to play the third team. On the draw it fell to Timmins to play at Kirkland Lake and the winners of this game will play the Dome at the winner's grounds. No dates have yet been decided upon.

The date of the return "International" game, "England" vs "Scotland," to be played at the Dome, was confirmed as Saturday, July 15th.

The next meeting of the N.O.F.A. is to be held at the Dome on Saturday July 22nd.
