TIMMINS JUNIORS WON FIRST DISTRICT GAME

In a very good game, though the grounds were very heavy after the rain, Timmins Juniors won the opening game at the Dome in the new Junior League schedule on Monday night. The score was 3 to 2. Dome scored first and Timmins equalized before half-time, the first half closing with a tie score. In the second half, with the sun and wind in their favour, Timmins forwards in nice combination made two more scores in quick succession and though the Dome also got one, the Timmins lads maintained their lead, the final score, despite the hard work of the Dome Juniors being 3 to 2. Mr. Harry Ewart refereed the game acceptably, and the linesmen were Messrs. Lucas and John.

SEVERAL SERIOUS CASES AT POLICE COURT TO-MORROW

At police court to-morrow (Thursday) Wm. Stanley will face a charge in connection with the passing of a cheque for \$85.00. The cheque was made out payable to John Graboski and was signed "William Stanley." The man Stanley is accused of endorsing the cheque and cashing it, the book-keeper at a local grocery store not noticing that the endorsement was otherwise than called for by the cheque. As soon as he saw that men were after him he took to his heels and led the police a merry chase. Eventually he was overtaken in the Hollinger townsite and placed under arrest. He had some sixty dollars on his person when arrested, the rest of the proceeds of the cheque apparently having been spent.
