**PROMISING RESULTS ON BERNHART TP. CLAIMS**

The recent work done on the Ayoub and Assad mining claims in Bernhart Township, Kirkland Lake area, has met with very promising results. In one pit, three feet deep, the vein is 4 ft wide and gives an assay across this width of \$45.00. Samples on the surface before sinking this pit are said to have assayed \$4 to \$9 over the same width. Another pit, four feet deep, showed a vein 8 foot wide at the bottom. Assays on this vein run from 40 cents to \$6 in gold per ton, and \$4.70 per ton in silver. Trenching done on the claims suggest that the veins average from four to eight feet in width.

Arrangements are understood to be completed for the resumption of work at once on the Baldwin Company property at Kenogami Lake, north of Swastika.

**HORTICULTURAL EXHIBIT HERE LABOUR DAY, SEPT. 4**

In connection with the big day planned here for Labour Day, Sept. 4th, under the auspices of the Timmins Football Club, it is intended to have an exhibit of flowers, fruit, etc., grown in the North Land. A couple of years ago there was a similar exhibit on a Labour Day event held by the Football Club and the feature proved very interesting and popular. This year it is hoped that the Horticultural Exhibit will be even better than on the previous occasion. A poultry exhibit is another feature being considered for the Labour Day event by the Football Club. Other special features are also being planned and a real Big Day is confidently expected.

**LEHIGH UNIVERSITY STUDENTS VISIT HERE**

A party of mining students of Lehigh University in charge of Prof. R. L. Bartlett, visited here last week and were shown through the Hollinger and visited other mines and other points of interest. The party of students numbering about 40 left their University State (Pennsylvania) some days ago for a tour of the mining sections, coal, copper, nickel, silver, gold, etc. They had seven automobiles and a motor truck, tents, etc. and camp as they go along, taking a bird's eye view of the mining country. They left their autos at North Bay, coming on by train to Cobalt and here, and on returning picked up the auto outfit to go on to Sudbury and the Sault, thence across to the U.S.A. The tour will extend for 5 weeks and cover 3800 miles.
