PROMISING RESULTS ON BERNHART TP. CLAIMS

The recent work done on the Ayoub Township, Kirkland Lake area, has met with very promising results. In one pit, three feet deep, the vein is 4 ft wide and gives an assay across FOR SALE-Electric Washing Mathis width of \$45.00. Samples on the surface before sinking this pit are said to have assayed \$4 to \$9 over the same width. Another pit, four feet deep, showed a vein 8 foot wide at the bottom. Assays on this vein run from 40 cents to \$6 in gold per ton, and \$4.70 per ton in silver. Trenching done on the claims suggest that the veins average from four to eight feet in width.
