**HANDSOME CUP FOR DISTRICT BASEBALL**

Hamilton B. Wills & Co. Donate Fine Trophy. Becomes the Property Of First Team to Win It Two Years.

Some days ago the handsome new baseball trophy donated by H. B. Wills & Co. to the Northern Ontario Baseball Association arrived in town and was on display here for a few days, later being taken to Cochrane for exhibition. It will also be put on exhibition at the Falls. This is the second trophy given by the H. B. Wills Co., and though the first cup was an attractive one, this second handsome trophy far outclasses it. Indeed, few leagues can boast of as handsome a trophy as this one. The cup is of silver, with gold lining. The full width of the cup is twelve inches, while from tip of the one handle to tip of the other is nineteen inches. The base of the cup is of solid mahogany and is 7 inches high and 12 inches in diameter. On this base is mounted the silver cup which is 12 inches high. At each side of the cup there are silver plates surmounted with silver bats and a ball at the top. On the cup proper is the inscription: Northern Ontario Baseball Association Championship Trophy. Presented by Hamilton B. Wills & Co. 1922.

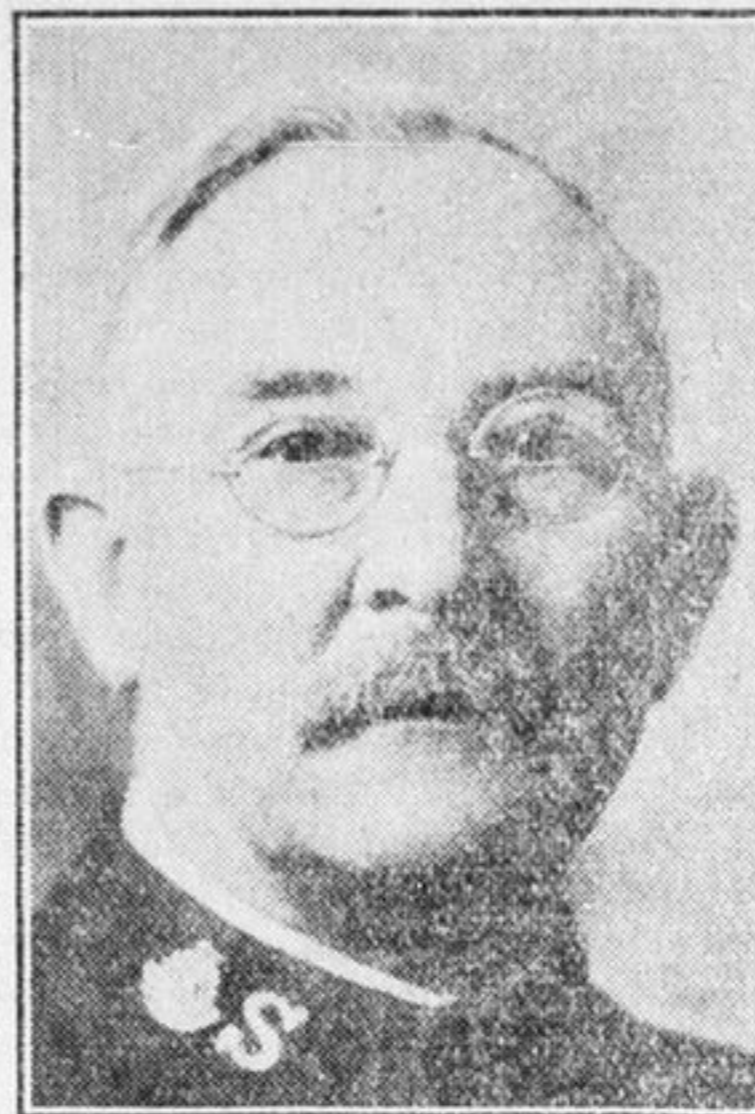
On the cup is a raised design of a player sliding to base while the player of the other team is reaching for the ball coming to him. This cup is one of the largest and most attractive of trophies and should tend to increase interest in district baseball as any town or team might well be delighted to win such a trophy even for a year. The H. B. Wills & Co. trophy will become the property of the team winning it two years out of three, or as many years as it takes for one team to win it twice. In other words, the first team to win it twice will secure the trophy for keeps.

The accompanying cut does not do justice to the trophy, but it will give an idea of its size and shape.
