**A. S. FULLER THE FIRST TO MOTOR OVER THE NEW ROAD**

Last Thursday evening, Aug. 24th, Mr. A. S. Fuller, Vice-President and Managing Director of the Premier Paymaster Mines Co., drove his Maxwell Roadster through from the mine to Timmins, over the new Government road in 16 minutes.

Mr. Fuller reports that the road is not yet entirely finished and that he encountered a lot of stumps and boulders for a quarter of a mile of the way, but that the road should be finished in first-class shape inside another week or ten days.

The road is graded from 40 to 50 feet wide and a large percentage of it is a natural fine sand and gravel. Other parts are finished with crushed rock and in a short time it will be the widest and finest road in the entire Porcupine camp.

The road starts in south of the Porcupine Crown mill and works off directly southeast to the Paymaster Mine, at which property it swings back Northeast through the Dome Lake Mines, West Dome Mines, Dome Mines and on into South Porcupine. Besides serving the above mines with a short cut to Timmins, it can also be used by the Anchorite Gold Mines, March Gold Mines, Clifton, etc. This road is considered by mining men as one that has been long needed and one that will be of immediate great value to the mines in that vicinity as well as the merchants and others in Timmins.

**RECORD MADE IN SHAFT SINKING AT THE GOLDALE**

The shaft sinking at the Goldale is said to establish a new record for speed in the gold camp. A three-compartment shaft was started on the Goldale, to the east of the McIntyre, and in the first twenty-eight days of work 144 feet of sinking was done. In 43 days there was 210 feet of shaft completed. In 69 days 298 feet of shaft-sinking was done, together with 20 feet of station cross-cutting. The work included complete timbering etc. An extensive development campaign is now under way at the Goldale, all the work done so far having met with very encouraging results.
