- CHINAMAN LOSES LIFE IN FIRE AT ENGLEHART**
- Early Thursday morning last Geo. Lung, an Englehart laundryman, was burned to death in a fire that seems to have started in his building. The fire, the origin of which is not known, spread very rapidly and before it was brought under control had wiped out four buildings, including the laundry, Macpherson's bakery and two residences. There were a number of families living in the buildings that burned down, but with the exception of Lung, all these were able to make their escape without injury. They lost practically all their possessions, however, in the fire. It is said that Lung also was able to get out of the burning building, but that he rushed back of his own accord. One story has it that his return was for the purpose of rescuing a pet cat that he believed was left in the blazing building. Another story is to the effect that it was a bunch of money that he returned to seek. Still another story says that the unfortunate man did not return at all, but on the other hand had been unable to escape from the burning building. His charred body was found at the foot of the stairs after the fire had burned itself out.
