**PRINCIPAL A. E. BRYSON LEAVING COBALT SCHOOL**

Mr. A. E. Bryson, for over nine years principal of Cobalt Public School, is shortly to leave the Silver Town for a position in the South. Speaking of the matter The Northern News says:—"Tributes to his worth were paid at the banquet given to the visiting teachers, and these, together with expressions of regret that he is leaving the Camp, will be re-echoed by the people with whom he has lived. With his departure there goes a good citizen, a man who did much to bring his adopted town and the North Country generally, to the attention of the people of the other parts of the province. Mr. Bryson has established a reputation for himself in this district and in our regret at losing him we would tender our sincere wishes for his future career."

It may be noted that it was largely through the interest and efforts of Mr. Bryson that the first tour of the North Land by the Ontario school teachers was organized. Mr. Bryson also took a helpful part in Board of Trade matters at Cobalt as well as being prominent in other public activities. He was also a useful and valued officer of the Temiskaming and Northern Ontario Associated Boards of Trade.

Kirkland Lake and Swastika residents are reported as having difficulty in securing high school accommodation for their children, both the Hailybury High School and the Monteth Academy having more applications from outside students than can be accommodated. It is proposed to make representations to the Department to have a High School teacher located at Kirkland Lake or Swastika to provide the desired facilities for higher education. —36

**PROVINCIAL POLICE FORCE TO BE ENLARGED**

According to despatches from Toronto recently the strength of the provincial police will shortly be increased by about 30, and it is probable that the force in the North Country, particularly, will be enforced. The rank of sergeant has been or is being established, so that when the inspector at district headquarters is away the sergeant will be in charge. The provision of a number of motorcycles, it is considered, would help the work of the police materially. In the last report something along this line was recommended by General Elliott, the former commissioner.

**SAFETY FIRST**
