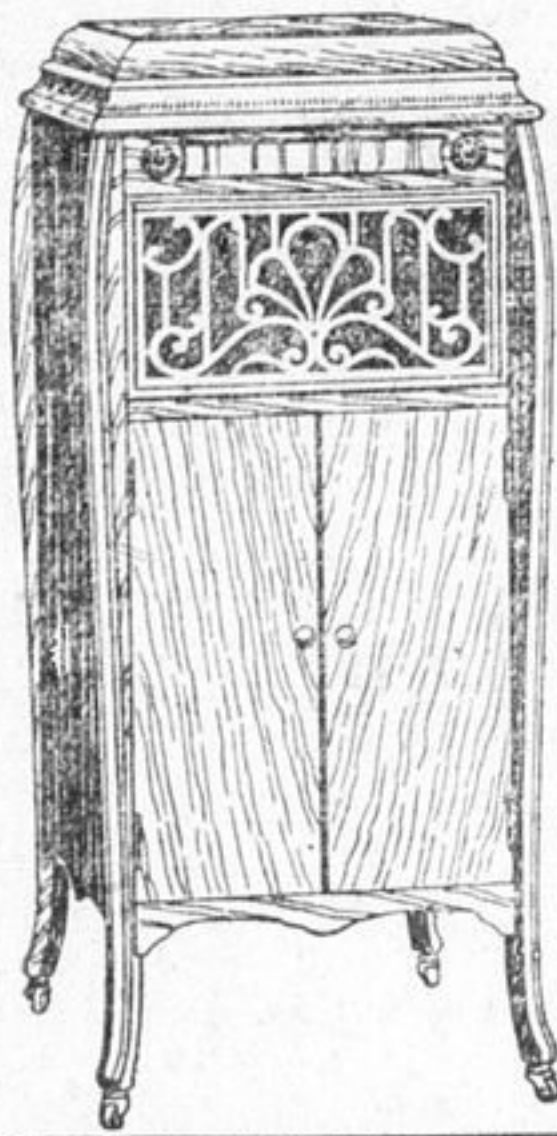

FORMAL OPENING OF NEW HOSPITAL AT MATHESON

Useful and Valuable Institution at Matheson under Auspices of the W.M.S.

The formal opening of the new hospital at Matheson took place last week with appropriate ceremony. The new Matheson hospital, while just opened formally has been doing useful work for some four months past. During that time about 120 patients have been treated and all speak very highly of the hospital and staff. Dr. Dawson is the resident physician in charge and the nurses in charge are Nurses Chambers and Maitland.

Before the formal dedication services the delegates present for the occasion were entertained at supper by the ladies of Matheson. The formal opening and dedication was under the chairmanship of Rev. J. F. Anderson, of Swastika and Kirkland Lake. The hospital is one of those established to fill the needs of the North Country by the W.M.S. of the Presbyterian church of Temiskaming district and Rev. Mr. Anderson paid high tribute to the ladies for their fine work. Dr. A. Mackay, Inspector of Hospitals, referred to the need of such institutions of relief throughout New Ontario, and pointed out that while his Department could not institute such work it stood ready to help with money grants, as had been done in the case of the Hearst hospital. He referred also to the fact that hospitals were not money-makers and the only profit for the W.M.S. was the satisfaction of knowing that they had given good service. Rev. Mr. Howard, Anglican minister at Matheson, Mrs. J. D. Walker, Toronto, Provincial President of the W.M.S., Mrs. J. D. McArthur, of Haileybury, representing the Temiskaming Presbyterian, Mrs. H. C. Harvey of Elk Lake, Mrs. H. M. Kipp, Hospital Convenor of the Dominion Executive, and Rev. Mr. Russell of Englehart, were among the other speakers.

Although the ladies of the W.M.S. had only \$6,000.00 to go on with, the new Matheson hospital impressed all with its equipment and the apparent efficiency evident throughout.

Delivery of mail by letter carriers is to commence in North Bay on Oct. 9th.
