**POT OF TAR CAUSES FIRE**  
AT RESIDENCE ON FRIDAY

Friday afternoon at 2:30 an alarm of fire was turned in from Box 34 and the firemen made their unflinching speedy response. The fire was at 79 Fourth Avenue at the residence owned and occupied by Mr. W. L. Smith. A can of tar being heated on the stove boiled over and set fire to the kitchen. With the use of one line of hose the brigade soon knocked flames out of that fire. The damage done was not great, and the loss entailed is covered by insurance.

**COSTLY TO KEEP COWS ON**  
THE PUBLIC ROADS IN TOWN

At the police court on Thursday last emphasis was given to the fact that this town is too big and busy to permit the straying at large on the streets of cows, horses and so on. Magistrate Atkinson emphasized the truth with fines ranging from \$5.00 and costs to \$15.00 and costs. Mrs. Geo. Panchuk, Mrs. N. Villano, H. Feldman, T. Toko and S. Mammolite each were fined \$5.00 and costs for allowing cows to be at large on the public ways of the town. W. Fritte, whose cows had offended before, was fined \$10.00 and costs, while N. Shubb and J. Gregore each paid \$15.00 and costs having failed to learn the lesson the court had hoped to impress by previous fines this year.

There were four drunks at Thursday's court, each of them being fined \$10.00 and costs. One of them had thought he might stop Chief Greer from arresting another man on a more serious charge. "Oh, but you can't stop them police no how," Andro says. Another of the four fined was a woman,—the first woman to be fined here for drunkenness in many, many moons.

For wounding Mr. H. Kideckel, Mike Chanovski was sentenced to three years in Kingston Penitentiary. The evidence showed that Chanovski owed an account at Kideckel's store and invited the store-keeper to his room so that the amount could be paid. While at Chanovski's room, Mr. Kideckel was attacked by the prisoner and while attempting to escape was stabbed in the back with a knife. The wound, though a painful one, is not likely to prove serious and Mr. Kideckel is making good recovery. The Magistrate, however, has a decided prejudice against the use of knives or other weapons, and the public generally are pleased to see that he translates his objection to this form of warfare into terms that have the effect of deterring a certain type of men from the free use of knives and similar weapons. The comparative freedom of this Camp from crimes of this sort is no doubt due in large measure to the attitude of the Police Magistrate in impressing on one and all the fact that the law will be enforced to the limit in regard to the use of knives, etc.

Mrs. Kosuk was fined \$300.00 and costs for illegal sale of liquor. The charge against M. Hern of assaulting a girl about 15 years old was dismissed after the evidence had been heard.
