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PAYMASTER AGAIN MAKES RICH HIGH-GRADE STRIKE

Remarkable New Discovery 800 Feet Made This Week East of Main Shaft.

Another sensational discovery of high grade gold ore was found last week on the Premier Paymaster Mines property in Porcupine just south west of the Dome Mines.

It was only about three weeks ago that this company opened up underground at the 300 foot level what has been pronounced by many mining men and engineers who have seen the ore, as the richest and most spectacular free gold discovery ever seen.

Not the least remarkable part of the new discovery of high grade this week, is the fact that it was encountered at a distance of over 800 feet east of the present underground workings right on the surface, and lying apparently in the direct line of body running to the southeast of the main shaft. This new showing is a very large and spectacular one, the gold being very coarse in many places, as well as occurring very finely distributed throughout the porphyry schist as well as the quartz. The new discovery is being rapidly opened up and the ore bagged preparatory to being shipped. It shows a width of about 8 feet at this writing.

The recent series of high grade strikes on the Paymaster Mine is very largely due to the very aggressive and energetic policy of the management. In addition to a very vigorous underground development program, which has been carried on steadily night and day, the management have had a large force of surface labour continually at work during the past 4 months this summer, trenching and stripping, and many thousands of feet of this class of work has been done, with the results highly successful as this latest high grade strike has proven.

Diamond drilling is also being conducted night and day, the company's plans calling for 10,000 feet of such development. The present drilling is now being done from the surface, but later a great deal of such diamond drilling will be done from the different underground levels.

The Paymaster Mine is controlled in Boston and is being financed there by a group of well known mining men,

who are at the present time successfully operating three other mines in the Butte, Montana Copper District. Mr. A. S. Fuller, the well known pioneer mining man of the Porcupine Camp, is Managing Director. Dr. Walter Harvey Weed, Geologist of New York City is Consulting Engineer and B. L. Eastman, E. M. Gen'l Manager.

During the past six months this company has rapidly forged to the front in many ways, and the property is regarded by mining men as one that will soon be adding very largely to the already big production now coming from the Porcupine Camp.

It is understood that milling plans have been under discussion by the company's officials for some time, but no definite announcement has yet been made in this connection. It is stated that the company is in a very strong position financially.

DIRECTORS PLEASSED WITH PROGRESS AT VIPOND

Speaking of progress at the Vipond Consolidated, the Hamilton B. Wills & Co. Market Despatch last week says:

"After spending a few days at the mine the President and Directors expressed themselves as entirely pleased with progress being made in underground development and shaft sinking at Vipond Consolidated. That results are satisfactory is clearly indicated to us by the steady volume of buying coming from the miners and other residents of Porcupine. Drifting operations along the big vein at the 600-foot level continue, we are advised, to bring new ore into sight and the management is most anxious to open up this vein to a depth of 1,000 feet as quickly as possible, as it is believed, the results to be met with will be identical to those recorded on the adjoining Hollinger Mine as increased depths are developed the grade of ore runs much higher. This also refers to McIntyre situated close by, and engineers express their views as believing that the southerly vein system of the Hollinger will traverse Vipond Consolidated. It is also believed that from the Porcupine Crown a vein of large dimensions and running high in gold content extends directly into the Vipond at around a depth of 1,100 ft. It is, therefore, very evident that the possibilities of this 160 acre property cannot be measured at this time, and the likelihood of a large gold producing mine being developed is very much in its favor."
