## LANDS OF SPECULATORS

At the Fire Marshall's enquiry into the recent central Temiskaming fire, special emphasis was given some days ago to the danger to the settlers from lands held for speculative purposes. Most of these lands were Veteran Grants and had been held for years. On Hilliard Township alone, according to the testimony of C. Wood, municipal clerk, twenty-five per cent. the land was held as Veterans' lots, uncleared except where roads had been put through or fires had burned. These lots were held apparently for speculative purposes, at prices higher than they were worth. One other wit ness suggested that the holders of the Veteran claims be compelled to settle on the claims or forfeit them. The general opinion of the witnesses was that these lands held for speculation constituted a direct fire menace and retarded the general safety and settlement. 
