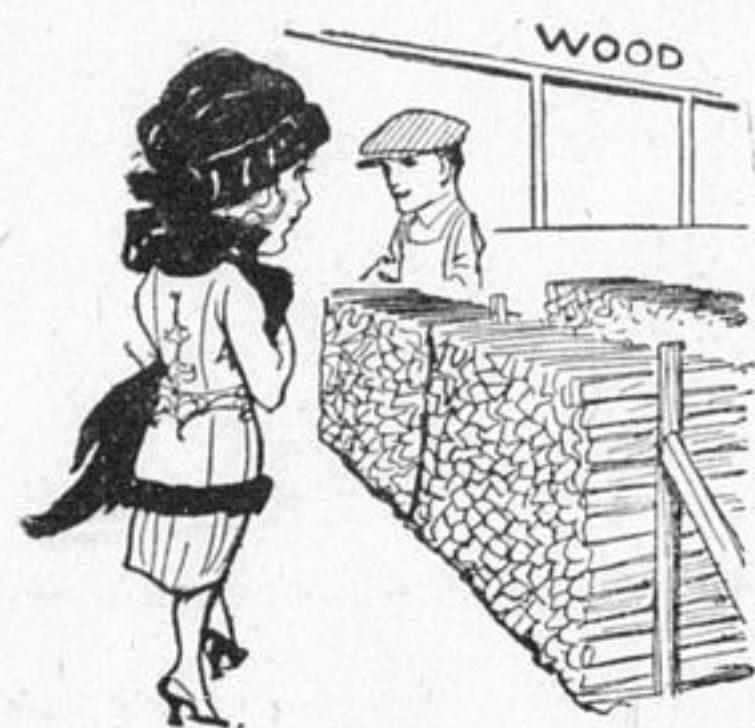

PROGRESS BEING MADE IN RE-BUILDING HAILEYBURY

Progress is being made in the re-building of Haileybury, though many of the Haileybury people are postponing their main building operations until spring. Although there are also many who have taken advantage of the good weather to commence on their permanent buildings. Among the business places now in Haileybury the following may be noted:—dry goods store, men's wear store, 2 drug stores, 1 furniture store, 1 butcher shop, 3 restaurants, 1 grocery, the biggest livery stable ever in operation in the town, barber shop, large garage, two banks, hardware store, 1 wholesale grocery, etc.

Mr. F. R. Gibson is making good progress with his three-storey 40 x 40 block on Ferguson Avenue. The new brick block for the Union Bank is almost completed. The new premises for Norfolk and Rochester, hardware merchants, are well under way, as is also Mr. Jory's new drug store.

LUMBERJACK LEFT \$2600 TO MAN WHO BEFRIENDED HIM

Tom Price, an Englishman working as a lumberjack, who died at North Bay last month, left his whole estate of \$2600.00 to a friend, Mack O'Donnell, North Bay. Mr. O'Donnell gave very kindly care to Price during his last illness and as a mark of appreciation for O'Donnell's kindness Price remembered him in disposing of his property by will. Price was about 68 years of age and had been working in lumber camps for some time. Some weeks ago his jaw was pierced by a sliver while he was at work and death eventually resulted from this simple injury, the sliver burrowing its way to the brain.

ANNUAL DOME FOOTBALL DANCE TO-MORROW NIGHT

The annual Dome Football Dance will be held to-morrow evening, Nov. 23rd., in the I.O.O.F. Hall, South Porcupine. The event was announced for some weeks ago but was postponed on account of the death of Mr. Graham Paterson. The Dome Football Dance for years past has proven a very pleasing and enjoyable event and arrangements have been perfected to make the Dance tomorrow night better than ever. Dancing will be from 9 to 1, and Brown's Orchestra will furnish the music. Lunch will be served. At this end of the Camp the big grey bus will leave Meyers' Drug Store corner at 8 p.m., returning from South End after the dance.

PORCUPINE-DAVIDSON HAS "HORSESHOES" ON IT

When the location of the trunk-head of the new three-compartment shaft was being marked out at the Porcupine-Davidson Mines property recently, Col. Fielding, consulting engineer, found a horseshoe on the spot selected. He considered this so lucky a sign that he promptly named the new shaft the Horseshoe Shaft, so that full value might follow from the lucky omen. Col. Fielding also marked out the new site for the new 500-ton mill. Power for the new mill will be supplied by the Matatchewan Power Company. It is expected that the Matatchewan Power Co. will be ready to supply power early next year. Col. Fielding has set sail for England after having made arrangements for development work on a large scale at the Porcupine-Davidson property.

PLANS OF BISHOP NOT YET DEFINITELY SETTLED

Reports have been in circulation to the effect that it has been definitely decided to move the Roman Catholic See of Haileybury to Cochrane. There does not seem full grounds, however, for these reports, as there has been no official announcement in the matter, and the Bishop's recent pastoral letter stated that nothing definite will be done until spring. In a recent issue of the Cochrane Post it was said that Bishop Latulippe had secured a residence in Cochrane and that this was taken as an indication that the central offices of the diocese and the new cathedral would be established at Cochrane. Under ordinary conditions the people of this part of the North Land would be delighted to see the Cathedral, Bishop's residence, etc., in this part of the North Land, but in view of the disaster recently overtaking Haileybury and that town's efforts to re-establish itself, few will be anxious to see Haileybury lose any of its former importance in any way.

HIGHER COURT LIKELY TO ADJOURN TO JANUARY

It is understood that there is a probability of the sittings of the Supreme Court for Temiskaming being adjourned to January of next year, though no official announcement to this effect has yet been made. The sittings of the Supreme Court had been set for December 11th. at New Liskeard, the Haileybury Court House having been destroyed by the fire. Many of the men summoned as jurors and witnesses for the higher courts are engaged in the work of re-building and re-establishing themselves after the fire disaster and representations in this regard have been made to the Attorney-General's Department to at least have the jury sittings laid over until the weather is such that outdoor work will not be possible. Accordingly, it is thought that the jury sittings of both the District Court on Dec. 5th and the Supreme Court on Dec. 11th. may be adjourned until the early part of January. There are heavy dockets for both courts, including a number of criminal cases, there being no less than two murder charges, one from Iroquois Falls and the other from Cochrane. The charges of high-grading against the five men concerned in the alleged misappropriation of Kirkland Lake gold ore were also to be tried at these courts. This latter series of cases may be tried by the District Court Judge if speedy trial is elected.
