CONTINENTAL LIKELY TO WITHDRAW FROM T. & N.O.

Will run to Winnipeg By More Direct Route. Will Mean Important Changes.

Last week intimation was given that the "Continental Limited" may be withdrawn from its run over the T. & N. O. railway, going to and from Winnipeg by a more direct route. This shorter route will be made by the construction of a cut-off from Nakina on the old T.C.R. to Long Lac on the former Canadian Northern. Tenders have been called for the construction of the cut-off line and the work is to be pushed forward without delay. Nakina is a couple of stations east of Kowkash, and Long Lac is about the most northerly point on the C.N.R. North Bay-Port Arthur line. The new route would considerably shorten the mileage from Winnipeg to Montreal. The proposed cut-off line is about 29 1/2 miles in length.

When the proposed cut-off line is completed it is practically certain that the Continental Limited will discontinue running over the T. & N. O. This will have important effect on the T. & N. O. service, especially north of Englehart. In this northern part the Continental Limited has been left to care for a large proportion of the passenger traffic. However, the T. & N. O. is apparently forestalling the discontinuance of the Continental, for announcement was made last week that Nos. 46 and 47 would after Dec. 4th, be through trains to Timmins. Dining car service on the T. & N. O. for these through trains is also probable. The running through of Nos. 46 and 47 will give direct service with Toronto and will be rated as a great improvement.

NEW KAPUSKASING PLANT WILL BE READY IN FEW DAYS

The new plant of the Spruce Falls Pulp Co. at Kapuskasing is getting into shape for operation and will likely be ready to start in a week or ten days. The plant will have a capacity of between 300 and 400 tons of sulphite per day. The plant contains five digesters. For the present the plant will be operated by steam turbines that can generate 2500 h.p. Future plans for the industry include the development of a water power some twenty miles down the river from Kapuskasing where 3000 horse power will be generated. The Spruce Falls Pulp Co. has large forest reserves from which to draw the necessary supply of pulpwood and the industry promises to be one of the important ones of the North Land.

42 MILES COMPLETE ON EXTENSION BY CHRISTMAS

A gentleman coming down this week from north of Cochrane says that 42 miles of the new T. & N. O. extension will be fully completed by Christmas. At present there is a stretch of 30 miles that is completed and that trains can run over, and have run over. Premier Drury and party recently went over this 30 mile stretch by train, and Chairman Geo. W. Lee and other members of the T. & N. O. Railway Commission have been over it more than once. The contractor expects to have another twelve miles completed by Christmas. This will bring the completed section a little this side of Newpost, some 42 miles north of Cochrane.

ANNUAL STATEMENT OF THE N.O.H.A. TREASURER

The financial statement of the treasurer of the N.O.H.A., as presented at the recent annual meeting, shows the N.O.H.A. to be in excellent financial position having a credit balance of \$1002.67. Of this balance \$500.00 is in Victory Bonds and \$502.67 in cash in the bank. The receipts include membership fees, \$40.00; annual fees, \$245.00; for year books, \$5.00; for protests, \$50.00; interest, \$29.30; receipts from Association play-off, \$147.10; O.H.A. play-offs, \$1,956.68. These with the balance in bank of Oct. 30, 1921, \$1,136.95, total \$3,610.03. The disbursements include cost of 1921 annual meeting, \$91.75; year books, \$183.00; other printing and stationery, \$48.65; telegraph, \$193.16; telephone, \$359.76; postage, \$50.00; O.H.A. annual fee \$12.00; trophies, \$174.45; exchange, \$8.00; express, \$16.43; insurance \$22.50; honorarium secretary and stenographer, \$375.00; executive meeting and delegates to O.H.A. annual meeting and play-off, \$782.46; Victory Bond, \$486.68; office supplies, \$4.85; N.O.H.A. play-offs, \$274.67.

The treasurer also gives a schedule of the membership and annual fees paid by the various clubs. Espanola, Blind River, Chapleau, and Cochrane paid each \$10.00 for membership and \$10.00 for Intermediate. Sault Ste. Marie, Sudbury, North Bay, New Liskeard, Timmins and Iroquois Falls, each paid \$10.00 for Senior, \$10.00 for Intermediate and \$5.00 for Junior. Little Current and Haileybury each paid \$10.00 for intermediate. Gore Bay and Cobalt paid \$10.00 each for Intermediate. Haileybury H. S. paid \$5.00 for Junior. The total membership paid was thus \$40.00, and the annual fees totalled \$245.00.
