The next regular meeting of the Town Council is scheduled for next Monday, Dec. 14th.

Mr. Hugh McEachren left on Monday to spend the winter at his old home at Glendale, Cape Breton. Mr. McEachren, who is one of the old-timers of the North Land, expects to enjoy Christmas at his old home for the first time in thirty years.

Mayor Russell, of Cochrane, who has been in poor health for some time and who went south for treatment, is back home in Cochrane and his friends in this district will be pleased to know that he has recovered his health and is back again to his duties.

Excellent progress is being made in the work of completing the handsome new R. C. church here. From the rate of progress made during the past few weeks it would appear that the new church will be ready at the time set, and that Christmas Eve the new church may be used for the Midnight Mass.
