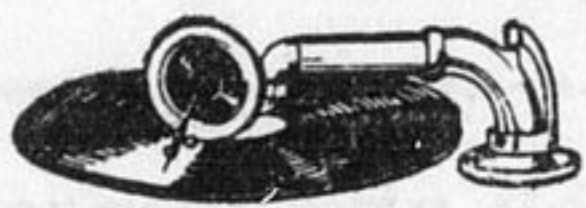

NOTICE

A synopsis of proposed By-law to authorize an agreement between the Municipal Corporation of the Town of Timmins and the Hollinger Consolidated Gold Mines Limited whereby it is provided that the Mine install a water pumping station on land near Mattagami River and a Twenty inch water main through the Town of Timmins; the Mine to supply the Town with all water required by the Municipality at cost, the lifetime of the work to be deemed 20 years, normal pressure to be 50 lbs. and Fire pressure 100 lbs; the Town to have first call on water for fire purposes.

The Town to convey to the Mine land necessary for Pump station and to lease the present pump station and land occupied therewith to the Mine; same to be maintained by the Mine; to chlorinate water passing through the existing ten inch main; and to permit the Mine to use without charge the present water main; to take all water required for town use from the Mine; to permit the Mine to use and occupy the highways of the Municipality for the purpose of such installation.

The agreement to endure for a term of ten years and for two further and successive terms of ten years each, or as long as permitted by the Municipal Act, and at the termination thereof the Town to have the right to purchase the plant and undertaking. Valuation to be fixed by arbitration.

The above is a true synopsis of a proposed by-law and if the assent of the electors is obtained to it it will be taken into consideration by the Council of the Municipal Corporation of Timmins after one month from the sixth day of December, 1922, being the date of first publication thereof, and the polls for taking the votes of the electors will be held at the Town Hall and Finlanders Hall in the Town of Timmins at the annual election on Monday the first day of January 1923, between the hours of Nine o'clock in the forenoon and Five o'clock in the afternoon.

On the 29th day of December, 1922, at the hour of Ten o'clock in the forenoon the Head of the Council of the said Corporation, or some member of the Council appointed for that purpose by resolution, shall attend at the Town Offices in the Town of Timmins for the purpose of appointing, and if requested so to do shall appoint by writing signed by him, two persons to attend at the final summing up of the votes by the Clerk, and one person to attend at the polling place on behalf of the persons interested in and promoting the proposed by-law and one person on behalf of the persons interested in and opposing the proposed by-law.

On the Second day of January 1923, being the day following the return of the ballot papers, at the hour of Twelve o'clock noon at the Town Offices in the Town of Timmins the Clerk of the Municipality shall attend and sum up the votes given for and against the proposed By-law.

The said By-law will be taken into consideration by the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Timmins in meeting at the Town Hall on Monday the 8th day of January, 1923. Dated, December 5th, 1922.

The Porcupine

The Clifton Now Producing

The Clifton Porcupine in Deloro Township, not far from the Dome Mines, and in the immediate vicinity of the Paymaster, is one of the smaller properties that has made a noteworthy showing this year. Development work on extensive plan met with excellent results. The main shaft is now down 220 feet and a pleasing body of good ore has been encountered in the work. A mill of 40 tons capacity was installed recently and is now running, treating about 30 tons daily. It is worthy of special note that the money from the production is not to be used for dividends but to further develop this very promising property. The Clifton consists of 47 acres, and recent work has been unusually pleasing and successful. The Clifton certainly promises to be a good little mine in the making.

Consolidated West-Dome Lake

The Consolidated West-Dome Lake is the amalgamation of the Dome Lake and West Dome Consolidated, two very promising properties consisting of 8 claims adjoining the Big Dome. The new company has a capitalization of five million dollars. A new hoist, transformers, etc., have recently been installed and added to the previous equipment make a nice little mining plant. De-watering of the property will be done at the beginning of the new year. The main shaft is down 600 feet. The mill on the property has a capacity of 100 tons a day. The prospects for this property look good.

Much Good Work on the Golddale Claims.

The Golddale properties are controlled by the company incorporated to take over the Bewick-Moreing properties in the Porcupine. In this company the Kerr Lake Mine people of Cobalt have the controlling interest. They have a list of 52 claims in the Porcupine. This year work has been concentrated on the property at the north end of Pearl Lake. Considerable diamond drilling has been done with pleasing results, and a shaft has been put down 525 feet. The sinking

of this shaft was specially noteworthy for the record time in which the work was accomplished. There has been considerable cross-cutting, drifting and other underground work, all with good results it is understood. There has been a considerable amount of commercial ore encountered in the work done, and prospects look very bright. The Golddale also has a number of other very favourably located claims that may later prove worth.

Diamond Drilling at Newray

The Newray property is under option to the Coniagas Co. of Cobalt and reports relative to the property are very good. Recently an extensive diamond drilling campaign was completed, with the results reported as very satisfactory. The plant is being put in shape and it is expected that de-watering will be under way before the first of the year, and mining operations conducted on a good scale. There will be shaft-sinking, cross-cutting, etc., to catch the ore bodies located by the diamond drill work.

THE PORCUPINE PENINSULAR

In the section where the first gold finds were made in Porcupine,—the Night Hawk Lake area,—there is one of the most promising properties in the North Land. This is the Porcupine Peninsular, or, as it is now termed, "The Night Hawk Peninsular Mines Limited." During the past year this property has developed from a prospect to a real mine in the making. The company owns and controls under Crown Lease and working options and agreements some 1230 acres in the Townships of Cody and Macklem, about ten miles south by water from Connaught Station.

Exploration by shafts, pits, diamond drilling, trenching and outcrops has demonstrated a continuous ore fissure for a distance of 10,000 ft., the ore bodies and conditions at both ends and the middle being similar. Intensive development to date has been restricted to the western end of the fissure, where over \$1,600,000 of ore of an average grade, top, bottom and sides of \$12.00 per ton has been de-

finately blocked out, in an area of less than a quarter of an acre, or 3% of the length of the main fissure and to a depth of 300 ft.

A new mining plant and equipment was installed last month. It has a capacity of 15 drills, and with the new hoist will carry development work to the 1000 ft. level. It is said that \$500,000 of new ore reserves are being definitely blocked out each month. The Peninsular has made very noteworthy development and is a most promising property, most efficiently managed and conducted.

Porcupine Paymaster Encounters Spectacular Gold.

The Porcupine Paymaster during the past year has been meeting with exceptional encouragement as a result of very extensive and very conscientious development work. This property consists of 129 acres located in the Township of Deloro. Work has been effectively carried on during the past year and the results have been consistently pleasing while in some instances spectacular finds have been made. The main shaft has reached a depth of 400 feet, large bodies of good ore being encountered. On the 200-ft. level a large body of low-grade commercial ore was developed being about 95 feet in width. Cross-cutting on the 300-ft level encountered some of the most spectacular free gold showings ever seen in this district. On the 400-ft. level high-grade ore was again encountered in two different places for considerable length. The unusually high-grade ore still being found at the Paymaster is causing this property to loom up as one of the probable early new producers for the coming year. In view of the fact that the management is installing a small experimental mill to handle the high-grade that is being so frequently run into, it is very probable that the mine will enter the producer class very shortly. High-grade is also being mined by the company from No. 3 shaft, about 1000 feet east of the main workings. While not so spectacular this ore is rich and well-sprinkled with free gold. The section in between Shafts 1 and 3 is being diamond drilled, there being three diamond drill outfits now on the property. The Paymaster has a good equipment, with comfortable quarters for the employees. The money being spent is going into mining and development, and from all indications it is going to bring first-class returns. The Paymaster is generally regarded as a sure comer.
