



The above is a true synopsis of a proposed by-law and if the assent of the electors is obtained to it it will be taken into consideration by the Council of the Municipal Corporation of Timmins after one month from the sixth day of December, 1922, being the date of first publication thereof and the polls for taking the votes of the electors will be held at the Town Hall and Finlanders Hall in the Town of Timmins at the annual election on Monday the first day of January 1923, between the hours of Nine o'clock in the forenoon and Five o'clock in the afternoon.

On the 29th day of December, 1922, at the hour of Ten o'clock in the forenoon the Head of the Council of the said Corporation, or some member of the Council appointed for that purpose by resolution, shall attend at the Town Offices in the Town of Timmins for the purpose of appointing, and if requested so to do shall appoint by writing signed by him, two persons to attend at the final summing up of the votes by the Clerk, and one person to attend at the polling place on behalf of the persons interested in and promoting the proposed by-law and one person on behalf of the persons interested in and opposing the proposed

On the Second day of January 1923, being the day following the return of the ballot papers, at the hour of Twelve o'clock noon at the Town Offices in the Town of Timmins the Clerk of the Municipality shall attend and sum up the votes given for and against the proposed By-law.
