PENSION PLAN FOR T. & N.O. EMPLOYEES NOW IN FORCE

Employees Will Not Have to Pay for It, the Railway to Bear Whole Cost.

For a considerable time past plans have been under way to inaugurate a pension plan for the employees of the T. & N. O. Railway, and last week announcement was made that a plan had finally been adopted and it was now in force and effect. Arrangements for introducing the pension plan were made at the last conference between members of the T. & N. O. Railway Commission and Premier Drury at Toronto.

The schedule of pensions will be the same as in force on the Canadian Pacific Railway. It will apply to employees in good standing at the age of 65. Every employee of the road will be covered by the pension plan but it will be all financed by the Railway, employees not being required to contribute a cent of their earnings.

In an interview regarding the pension plan, Mr. Geo. W. Lee, Chairman of the T. & N. O. Railway Commission said:—"We do not consider that when a faithful servant reaches the age when he should be superannuated he should be entirely eliminated from the service. The pension scheme which is now in effect virtually means that an employee of good standing and entitled to a pension will practically remain an employee of the Commission, and his name will appear only on a separate payroll. He will also enjoy annual transportation over our lines for himself and family. The Commission is carrying the entire burden of the pension scheme, and employees of the Railway will not be asked to contribute a cent of their earnings."

The initial payments under the pension scheme have been provided for in this year's estimates. The principle of pensioning faithful employees at a certain age is a good one, and in the case of the T. & N. O. Railway is likely to meet with general public commendation. The employees of the T. & N. O. as a body give very faithful and sincere good service to the public and are well-known for their courtesy and efficiency. It is only fitting that this service should be recognized and appreciated in tangible form, so that there is not likely to be anything but commendation for the new pension plan in force on the T. & N. O.

The Railway employs about 1200 men.

SPECIAL BRANCH PARTY OF U.F.O. FOR THE NORTH

That a new political party is to be formed in Northern Ontario under the aegis of the U.F.O. to consider and discuss all questions of interest to the Northern part of the province especially the rural sections, was the statement made at Fort William last week by A. R. Ascoug, district president of the U.F.O., Port Arthur, back from the Toronto convention. "The question of a separate province was discussed," said Mr. Ascoug, "but not favorably. As a result of that discussion, however, we succeeded in obtaining for this part of the province a separate party, and the new party will hold a convention at North Bay in the spring."

PLAN FOR RE-PURCHASE OF THOMPSON-KRIST CLAIMS

There was a special general meeting of the shareholders of the Thompson-Krist Mining Co. Limited, held at Toronto on Tuesday of last week to consider a plan for the re-purchase of the claims of the Company from the Porcupine Crown Mines. At the meeting it was decided to proceed with a plan to re-purchase, free from all encumbrances, the three claims of the Thompson-Krist merged with the Porcupine Crown in the North Crown Mines, the price to be paid to be \$40,000.00, and the Thompson-Krist to turn over its share holdings in the North Crown Porcupine Mines.

CHRISTMAS EVE MASS AT THE FINE NEW R. C. CHURCH

The beautiful new R.C. church here was sufficiently advanced in construction for the holding of Christmas Eve Mass there as planned several months ago. The attendance at the service was unusually large, the number being estimated at between 1500 and 1700. Every available seat was taken and many had to stand for parts of the service. Temporary altars, temporary seating accommodation and complete lighting and heating were installed for the occasion. The completion of the interior decoration and finishing is now being rushed along on the new church.

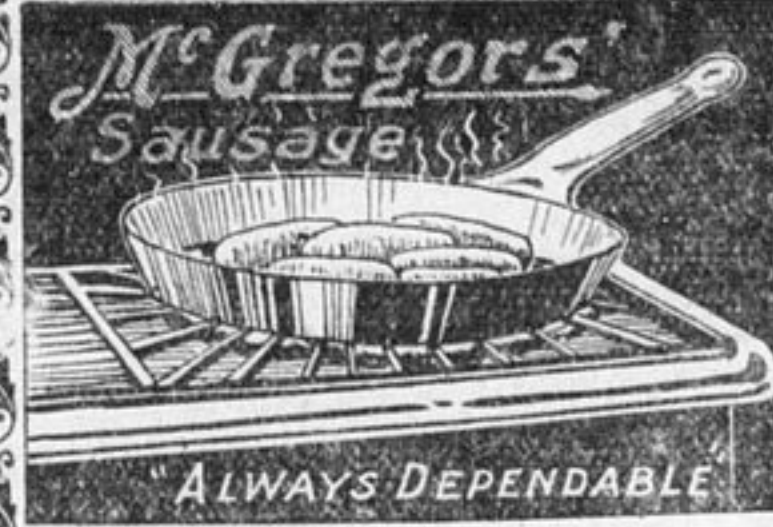
