

SOFT ICE AND HARD LUCK DEFEAT TIMMINS AT SAULT

broken up by Donnelly. Donnelly went through to Reis who came down but shot too wide. Puck shot to Timmins end, and Roach came through for what looked like a sure goal, but Walsh saved. Brown took the puck up, passed over to centre, but it was offside. From the face-off McGuire got the puck, taking a long shot, but Walsh saved. Frank is playing a hard game; also, Roach. Lessard got through the forwards. He met Roach fair and stopped. Roach passed to Spark Plug, who handed it over to Campbell. Don was well on his way when he was relieved by Brown. Doe Brown got away. Don tripped him and got a minute for it, but it looked like good work. Lessard went through but was too far past the goal when he tried to shoot. Campbell of the Sault shot but Scully saved. From an off-side near the Timmins nets Phillips had a shot on Scully, but Jim beat him. Spark Plug and Frank came through for a shot but it was too high. Brown stick-handled his way through but fell at the goal mouth. From there Roach took the puck through and shot a high one. Timmins are holding the Sault pretty close. However from a scrimmage right in front of Timmins goal Phillips batted the puck past Scully who did not have a chance, as he could not see it there being so many players in front of him. From the face-off Spark Plug took the puck down, passing to Behan who rushed through and had a shot shot on Walsh. Walsh saved nicely. Brown went up for a shot, got past the defence, but Scully saved. Phillips went through and scored again for the Sault. From the face-off Behan shoved it back to Spark Plug who came up. His pass to Behan was offside. Period closed, Sault 3, Timmins 1.

Timmins players are all going well. Roach and McGuire especially showing up. Doe Behan in a class by himself. The doctor has fooled them all with his poke check and nothing but hard luck has prevented him getting two individual goals at least.

In the opening of the second period McGuire rushed and brought Walsh to his knees. Brown took the puck off Walsh's stick and came through with Woodruff. Woodruff kicked the puck at the defence, and an off-side occurred. From this play Spark Plug made a rush. He passed to McGuire who was too far by the goal when he went to shoot. From a pass in front of the Timmins goal after Donnelly had brought the puck up, Phillips scored number four for the Sault. From the face-off, Lessard came through and made it five. The play got away on the Timmins boys a bit and the Sault got in these two lucky goals. Roach got a loose puck and he went through. He was in position to shoot when he was overbalanced by Donnelly. Donnelly came through. He passed out to Woodruff. Woodruff was off-side. From the face-off Behan took the puck through and he brought Walsh about ten feet out of his net, only to miss the net. Donnelly down. He was boarded by Bill Cameron, but Cameron did not go off. He took the puck down. He fooled the defence and had a shot on Walsh. This is Walsh's night on and he again saved. Fahey who is now playing for Brown took the puck down but was relieved at centre by Behan. Behan went right in. He again had a sure goal, only for Walsh. Walsh gave the puck to Lessard who came right through for another nice play. Lessard beat the defence, then he coaxed Jim out and had nothing but the open net. He made it another for the Soo. From the face-off, Cox, who is on now, took the puck. He gave it to Behan. Behan passed it over to Spark Plug who fooled Walsh nicely, making it Timmins 2. From the face-off Phillips came through. He ran up against Spark and was immediately relieved. Roach goes off for tripping Campbell. From the face off necessitated, Lessard rushed the goal. He shot high.

Lessard came through, and Jim made a nice save. McGuire took the puck from him and went clear through. He tried out Walsh; the puck lodged in Walsh's pads, and he saved the goal. Dixie off and Frank back on. McGuire took a rush; he beat the entire team; passed out to Campbell, who had his shot which was wide. Phillips off. He's gone to the dressing room, account hurting his knee. The game stopped for a second. Phillips collided with the boards, no one's fault. The game again called. Brown came through for a shot but was bested by Roach. Roach handed it over to Behan who shot. Walsh saved. McGuire went in for another shot. He brought Walsh out; Walsh fell on the puck causing a face off right in front of the Sault goal. From the face-off however, Campbell got the puck and came through for a shot. He was stopped by Spark. Spark goes off for tripping Woodruff. From the face-off which occurred when Spark went off, Lessard took the puck. He beat the defence and drew Jim out and got another goal for the Sault. From this face-off Cox got the puck. He went down for his shot, which the bartender saved. Brown gave a demonstration of his old-time play and gave the Sault and Timmins a nice exhibition of stick-handling and individual play, he went clear through, had a sure goal, when Jim Scully outguessed him. He did not score. Doe Behan is playing nice game. Time and time again he gets through to the defence only to be overbalanced when he gets in position to shoot. Spark goes off again for tripping. Phillips back on with a bandage around his knee. From the face-off Cameron got the puck; he rushed through; his shot was too wide. Doe Behan has another shot which brings Walsh to his knees. Brown takes the puck down; his pass to Phillips is off side. Spark back on. McGuire bumps Brown headlong into the boards. Stan gets up, and Farlow did not see a thing. That is one to Frank's credit. The puck is now rolling considerably account slow ice. McGuire went through for another shot but it was too wide. On account of the heavy ice there has been very little real hockey. Doe Behan got through several times only to wind up at the goal with a rolling puck. Spark has been doing noble work on defence. Anything that looks like a sure goal, he takes no chances and gets this man. This however has given Spark the majority of the penalties. There are no signs of rough play as yet. The ice in this period gave way very quickly and in some spots the water is showing through. Frank takes a long shot and almost has a goal just as the gong sounded for the close of the second period. The second period ended, Sault 7, Timmins 2.

From the face-off Frank takes the puck and has a long shot, but it is wide. Ten seconds later Frank has another shot, but Walsh saves. Phillips takes it from Walsh's stick and goes down. He passes to Woodruff, but the shot is wide. Roach comes down. He passes to Behan. The puck is kicked. Frank gets the puck from the face-off and goes in with Spark Plug. Spark Plug finds the corner of the net where Walsh is not and makes it 3 for Timmins. From the face-off Roach comes down. He gives it to Frank. Frank shoots, but it is wide. Phillips takes the puck down but is skated into the corner. Spark Reis is playing a good game. Roach gets away with a rolling puck but shoots wide. The puck is hard to drag and the players have great difficulty in carrying it. Brown goes up, passed to Phillips, who passes to Lessard, but the latter is bodied by Roach. Roach came through but his shot was wide. Cameron on for Campbell. Phillips goes up with a bouncing puck and has it taken away by Reis, Spark Plug passing to Frank McGuire who shoots, but it is too weak. Behan comes down and is checked by Brown. Brown passed to Phillips who passes to Lessard. Phillips off for boarding McGuire. Cox on for Behan. Cox rushes down with McGuire, but their shot is too weak. Lessard takes the puck down and is tripped, but no one goes off. Donnelly and Lessard go down but the shot is too wide. Woodruff and Brown the same. Cox, Roach

and McGuire came through in a nice piece of combination. They all but had a goal. Donnelly got away for a shot but Scully beat him. Phillips on again and rushes down with Lessard and again Jim saves. McGuire and Cox again come through. The puck is rolling so badly they can do nothing with it and all the nice plays that are to be expected are minus. Behan on again; Cameron off. McGuire off for tripping Brown. Don Campbell goes up with Spark Plug, and they test Walsh without avail. Donnelly went through. He had only Scully to beat but he could not do it. Roach went down and passed to Behan who shot wide. Behan had good speed and should have had a goal. Donnelly took the puck up, but was checked by Reis, who, however, overskated the puck on account of it rolling so much. Frank on again and takes it right through for a shot on Walsh. Walsh saves and gives the puck to Campbell who goes through only to be stopped by Spark Plug. Puck in crowd. Timmins now playing five men forward in an effort to get another goal. Phillips got the puck from the face-off but couldn't get by Spark Plug. Spark came down with McGuire. When McGuire was ready to shoot he was too far by the goal. Brown and Donnelly both leave the defence and Walsh pounds the ice to call them back. Doe Behan rushing the Sault forwards for all he is worth. Phillips and Woodruff go up ahead, but they are stopped at defence. Behan and McGuire come through, followed closely by Roach. When they are at the goal Roach

takes the puck but he is too wide. The play is now getting very slow on account of the rolling puck. Reis wants a rest and Don Campbell relieves him. From the face-off, Campbell comes down but loses to Donnelly, who, however, is overtaken by Don who shoots, but Walsh saves. Phillips takes a long shot and catches Jim on the pads. Roach coming down but cannot control the puck. Woodruff rushes up but is relieved by Behan who passed to McGuire. Frank puts a hot one past the goal mouth. Behan goes up for a shot which is saved by the bartender. Doe Behan had a nice play. Phillips goes up. The gong rang as Phillips was on his way. Final score, Sault 7, Timmins 3.
