

SCHEDULE OF GAMES FOR DISTRICT BASEBALL

Meeting of N.O.B.A. Decides on Two-Team Schedule. Mr. Jos. F. Smith, Official Umpire.

The first meeting this season of the Northern Ontario Baseball Association was held in Timmins last week, Iroquois Falls being represented by Mr. James Brown, and Timmins by Mr. Jack Marshall.

A letter received from Cochrane stated that on account of the recent epidemic that town would not be in a position to enter a team in the league this year, but would secure amateur cards for use in the event of a few exhibition games being arranged.

It was decided that May 31st should be the date set for the Residence Rule on which date amateur cards would have to be produced, or sufficient evidence from the Secretary of the A.A.U. of C., which would be in the form of a wire, stating that such application had been made for amateur cards, and that the same were in transit.

The matter of umpires was discussed and it was unanimously decided that Mr. Joseph F. Smith, of Iroquois Falls, be Umpire-in-Chief to officiate at all games, the base umpire to be chosen by the Home Club Team at the game.

The inability of Cochrane to put in a team this season, leaves only a two-team league, Timmins and Iroquois Falls, to start the season. The matter of a schedule was taken up and the following schedule was adopted: It will be noted that all the games at Timmins are on Thursdays and all at the Falls on Wednesdays. The first game is at Timmins for May 31st, and thereafter there is a game at Timmins every second Thursday. The following is the schedule:—

At Porcupine, on the 28th day of May, 1923, at the Council Chambers of the Township of Whitney, at the hour of 10 o'clock in the forenoon and will continue until the appeals are disposed of, to hear complaints as to the list of voters for the Municipality of the Township of Whitney and that John M. Greer, Esq., Barrister, will be the Revising Officer and his clerk will be J. M. Nicholson, Esq., whose address is Porcupine, Ontario.

At South Porcupine on the 28th day of May 1923, at the Council Chambers of the Township of Tisdale, at the hour of 2 o'clock in the afternoon and will continue until the appeals are disposed of, to hear complaints as to the list of voters for the Municipality of the Township of Tisdale and that John M. Greer, Esq., Barrister, will be the Revising Officer and his clerk will be F. C. Evans, Esq., whose address is South Porcupine, Ontario.

BY-LAW No. 9

A By-law of the Board of Trustees of the Roman Catholic Separate Schools for the Town of Timmins, to raise by way of loan the sum of \$75,000.00 for the purposes therein mentioned.

Whereas the Board of Trustees of the Roman Catholic Separate Schools for the Town of Timmins require to borrow the sum of \$75,000.00 to provide funds for the purpose of acquiring a school site in the said Town of Timmins and erecting a school building thereon, and for such purpose to issue debentures therefor, bearing interest at the rate of five and a half per cent. per annum which is the amount of the debt intended to be created by this by-law;

And whereas it is expedient to make the principal of the said debt repayable in yearly sums, during the period of twenty years, of such amounts respectively that the aggregate amount payable for principal and interest in any year shall be equal as nearly as may be to the amount so payable for principal and interest in each of the other years;

And whereas it will be necessary to raise annually the sum of \$6,275.97 during the period of twenty years to pay for said yearly sums of principal and interest as they become due;

And whereas the amount of the whole rateable property rateable for Separate School purposes in the said Town of Timmins, according to the last revised assessment roll, is \$1,085,180.00.

And whereas the amount of the existing debenture debt of the Board of Trustees of the Roman Catholic Separate Schools for the Town of Timmins is \$66,000.00 and no part of the principal or interest is in arrear.

Now therefore the Board of Trustees of the Roman Catholic Separate Schools for the Town of Timmins enacts as follows:—

1. That for the purpose aforesaid there shall be borrowed the sum of \$75,000.00 and debentures shall be issued therefor in sums of not less than \$100.00 each, bearing interest at the rate of five and a half per cent. per annum, and having coupons attached thereto for the payment of interest.

2. The debentures shall all bear the same date and shall be issued within one year after the date on which this by-law is passed, and may bear any date within such year, and shall be payable in twenty annual instalments during the twenty years next after the time when the same are issued and the respective amounts of principal and interest payable in each of said years shall be as set forth in Schedule "A" hereto which is hereby declared to be and form part of this By-law.

3. The debentures as to both principal and interest may be expressed in Canadian currency and may be payable at any place or places in Canada or Great Britain.

4. The Chairman of the said Board

shall sign and issue the debentures and interest coupons, and the same shall also be signed by the Secretary-Treasurer of the said Board, and the debentures shall be sealed with the Corporate Seal of the said Board.

5. During twenty years the currency of the debentures, the sum of \$6,275.97 shall be raised annually for the payment of the debt and interest and the sum of \$6,275.97 shall be annually included in the yearly Separate School rate to be levied and collected by the said Board for the said twenty years, the currency of the said debentures, and the said sum of \$6,275.97 shall be levied and collected annually by a special rate sufficient therefor over and above all other rates in the same manner and form and from the like persons and property by, from, upon or out of which other Separate School rates are levied, raised and collected, for the said period of twenty years.

6. The said sum of \$75,000.00 so borrowed and interest thereon and the said debentures shall be and the same are hereby made a charge upon the Schoolhouse property and premises and on the real and personal property vested in the said Board of Trustees of the Roman Catholic Separate Schools for the Town of Timmins, and upon all the Separate School rates of the said Board to be hereafter imposed until the said debentures and each and every of them, together with all interest thereon, shall have been fully paid and satisfied.

7. The said Debentures may contain any clause providing for the registration thereof authorized by any Statute relating to Municipal debentures in force at the time of the issue thereof.

Finally passed this 19th day of March 1923.
