**LIBERAL PARTY AGAIN  
 NOMINATES MAC LANG**

Convention in Choice Gives Present Member 161 Votes to 56 for E. Montfort. Interesting Features at Gathering.

The convention of the Liberal Party of Cochrane Riding, held at Porquiss Junction on Wednesday afternoon last, to select a candidate to carry the Liberal banner in the coming Provincial Election, was attended by well over two hundred delegates, all parts of the riding being represented. Mr. C. V. Gallagher, of South Porcupine, presided, and enthusiasm and interest were very evident all through the gathering.

The following officers were elected for the ensuing term for the Cochrane District Liberal Association:  
 President—C. V. Gallagher, South Porcupine.  
 Vice-President—Dr. L. Gagnon, Cochrane.

Second Vice-President—Dr. J. A. McInnis, Timmins.  
 Third Vice-President—L. A. Lillieo, Kirkland Lake.

Secretary-Treasurer—W. G. Bowles, South Porcupine.

After the election of the officers, the Convention proceeded with the nomination of a candidate. Five names were proposed, these being:—Mac Lang, M.P.P.; E. Montfort, now of Ansonville, but formerly of Cobalt; J. N. Tremblay, of Fanquier, Ont.; Dr. Gagnon, of Cochrane, and Dr. J. A. McInnis, of Timmins.

Dr. McInnis, in a brief speech, said that at the present election he would not be a candidate, but perhaps at some future time he might be able to serve the party and the country in such a capacity. He expressed his thanks for the nomination, but would withdraw. Dr. McInnis pointed out that while the U.F.O. Government had perhaps done its best so far as its experience and ability allowed, he did not think that class government was the right kind or practical in a democratic country like this.

In a brief but effective response, Dr. Gagnon also signified his desire to withdraw his name.

Mr. Tremblay made a striking impression on the convention, his eloquent address being a feature of the day. He made an earnest plea for unity among all Canadians. "Let us all be Canadians first, last and all the time," he urged. He also showed a remarkable grasp of the needs and possibilities of the North Hand having facts and figures at his command in striking array. Mr. Tremblay withdrew his name before the voting took place, the delegates eventually selecting the present member, Mr. Mac Lang, by 161 votes as against 56 cast for Mr. Montfort, the other nominee standing to test feeling of the Convention.

In his address to the Convention Mr. Mac Lang condemned the Government for its land settlement and timber policies, if any, and for various other sins of commission and omission. He thought also that the territory represented by Cochrane Riding should have two members in the Legislature and he blamed the Government and the Conservative party for the failure to pass a Redistribution measure. Mr. Lang made no mention of his transferring his seat away from the Liberal section of the House last year, nor were any questions asked him in this regard. Accordingly it may be taken for granted that the Convention had no objection, and that Liberals in this riding agree with Mac Lang rather than with Wellington Hay, the Liberal leader in the Legislature.

Mr. Montfort devoted the greater part of his address to an impassioned appeal against Regulation 17. Mr. Montfort thought this regulation fanatical and unfair, and wanted it taken off the statute books. He said that the French-speaking people represent 65 per cent. of the people of the riding, and he thought the member for the riding accordingly should be one

of their number, this being his reason for standing for the nomination. He condemned Hon. G. Howard Ferguson for being a party to the framing of Regulation 17, and he looked to the Liberal Party as the only possible source of relief.

Another speaker of the Convention was Mr. D. McEachren, of Cobalt, who thanked the delegates for the support accorded him when he was the candidate in the Dominion Election in Temiskaming. He made an attack on the Drury Government for its improper attitude towards the North Land and for its general sins as well. One of his catchy phrases was his reference to Premier Drury as "the sovereign pontiff of political morality."

**WORK LIKELY TO START  
 SOON ON RYPAN IN DELORO**

Extensive work is understood to be likely to be commenced soon on the Rypan property in Deloro Township. At present there is noteworthy activity in Deloro and the promising properties there are being given a chance to come into their own. The Rypan Mines offer at present an issue of shares for the purpose of sinking a shaft. Work on the Rypan is said to have indicated good values of ore and exploration work has suggested a property of promise. Recently the Rypan purchased some additional claims near their property and these also will be opened up.
