Cochrane, Smooth Rock and Kapuskasing to Play Series. Winner To Play Winners for King And Dickson Cups.

Kapuskasing are to have a football league this year and will compete for the King and Dickson Cups, and perhaps for the Goodyear Cup as well. They will play their league series, with the three teams competing, and the winner of each series will play the winner in the Timmins-Dome-Kirkland Lake series. This was agreed to at the meeting of the N.O.F.A. at the Dome Saturday evening. The plan seems to be a specially good one for all concerned. It allows Cochrane, Smooth Rock Falls and Kapuskasing to have football this season without prohibitive expense for travelling. At the same time interest is maintained because the cups are in competition. For Timmins, Dome and Kirkland Lake, there is the same advantagethe increase of interest in the competitions through the addition of the Northern teams, without the added expense of travelling, etc., for regular games in a schedule that would mclude the northern teams. The group plan thus inaugurated should greatly increase interest in football in the North Land, without adding much to ts cost. There is great interest being shown in football this season at Cochrane, and all should do everything possible to help Cochrane along. Cochrane has undoubtedly been hard hi by the fever epidemic there, and it will take some time and much hard going for the town to get back to normal prosperity. Good sport is necessary to cheer the people along and to provide the entertainment and recreation so useful in upholding health and strength and courage. MORE POOR ADVICE GIVEN. TO MEN BY JOE KNIGHT

It would appear as if it would pay the workers of the Porcupine to keep-Joe Knight away from this Camp, When the United Mine, Mill and Sme ter Workers' Union was going along nicely here, Knight came here and got busy. The result was that the International Union dropped away just at the time when it bid fair to secure the full support and co-operation of all. Then the O.B.U. was started here, with Knight as one of its boosters. For a time the O.B.U. went along, and then Knight came back and got busy in the Camp, and the O.B.U. faded away. More recently the Porcupine Miners Union was established as a strictly local union. Knight has been paying special attention to this Camp lately and if his plans go as they went in the past, the latest union will likely follow the way of the others. Knight is also credited with similar success at Cobalt and other places. One strong union man recently suggested that it would play the "bosses" to pay Joe just to stick around. Certainly he is not a very far-sighted friend of the workingman from his own line of talk. At Cobalt some days ago he held a public meeting at which he was to give "the truth" about the labour situation in Porcupine. The meeting was not largely attended, and the "truths" proved much the same way. One of the "facts" given, for instance, was that the May Day parade here had 2000 people in it. Knight also told his Cobalt audience that he had advised the men at Porcupine to 'strike on the job" if they did not want to go on a regular strike. Just at the present time this advice may be considered as specially ill-timed from every viewpoint. To advise the men to greater effort and efficiency would be a much surer method of assuring wage increases. In Canada, the foreign scheme of "striking on the job" or shirking, has never gotten the work ers anything but "the sack." On the other hand increased efficiency and attention to work is a very common fore runner of increased pay. Only actors, L models and labour agitators are paid
