## IROQUOIS FALLS WINS OPENING GAME OF BALL

Tate's Hitting and McLean's Fielding Features of the Game. Falls Stages Come-Back.

Iroquois Falls blew into town on Thursday last and pried the lid off the baseball season by coming from behind and winning the opener, 9 to 8.

Flanders, a newcomer with the Papermakers, started off on the mound but was given a hot reception and only stayed three innings, giving way to Elliott Little, the Papermakers' old reliable hurler.

The Falls scored one run in their half of the first innings on a single and a triple by Coons and Brydge, after two were out. The Miners came back strong, scoring four runs on a double, a hit batsman, a walk and three singles, and an error by Gauthier.

The Falls added another in the fourth, and six more in the fifth, on four hits and as many errors. Tate gave way to Spence, the latter pitching a very nice game. He should beat the Falls on his next start.

Manager Marshall didn't show any fear or favour in picking his line-up, and when and where to place them, and he should round out a winning aggregation on their next appearance.

Both teams showed the fans some new material. Flanders and DeRosier with the Falls, were new men for the Papermakers. DeRosier is likely looking material and is fast on the bases. Fournier, who is filling DeStefano's place at third, is doing nicely. He may not cover as much ground as Johnny, but he is strong at the bat. White at centre was a little uncertain in judgment at times, and Dr. Behan appeared a little weak at the plate, but these points may right themselves with practice. Johnny Monaghan did well for a young player getting into fast Senior ball.

Gill, the catcher, is quite handy with the willow, getting two hits and a walk. McIntyre, who caught the last half of the game, showed that he is still the old reliable. McLean at short showed the best league class, and Tate's batting proved of great value in itself and when the big fellow is right it takes a mighty good team to beat him. Scully is a reliable fielder and a brainy ball player and knows how to run bases. Charlie Sheehan can always be depended upon, and Thursday he made a couple of spectacular catches that helped some. Chisholm, a newcomer, didn't have a chance to show his wares, not being in uniform, but he will get into the line-up in the next game.

There was a good crowd out for the opening game of district ball, and all thought it a good exhibition for the first game of the season.

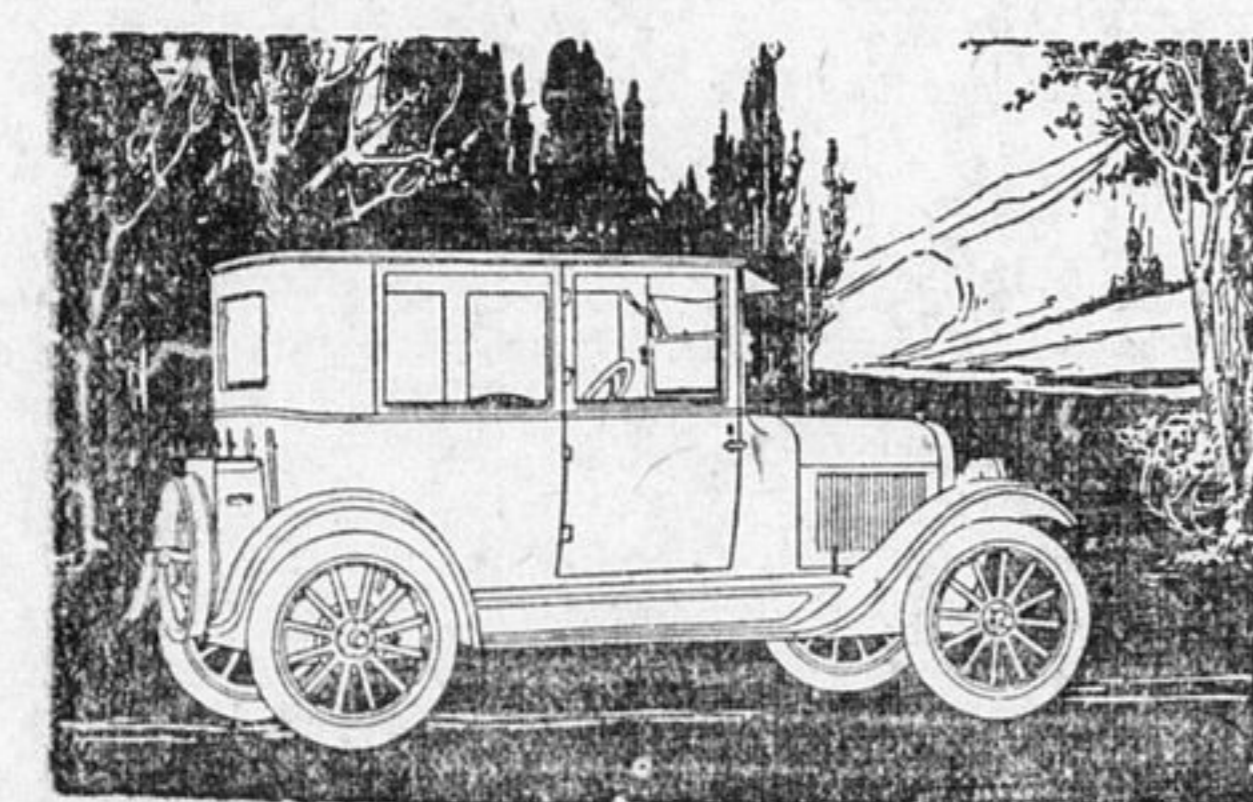
