LIBERAL LEADER HAY HERE

franchises after studying the ques-
tions of the day. One of the sug-
gestions he made was to vote for the
best man in the field, irrespective of
anything but the best interests of the
country. He thought this best man
in Cochrane riding was Mr. Mac Lang,
whom he described as a "strong man
and able." Leader Hay did not out-
line his platform, confining himself to
generalities. He said if it became nec-
essary to abuse his opponents he
would withdraw from political life.
One point touched upon by Mr. Hay
was the Government regulations re-
garding the sale of timber berths. He
pointed out that these regulations
practically excluded the smaller mills
from tendering. The same point, it
will be noted, was discussed at the
Board of Trade meeting here on Mon-
day. Mr. Hay urged that undue stress
be not placed on "North" or "South"
or "New" or "Old," but that all
parts should co-operate for the com-
mon good. "I am not making any pro-
mises as to what we will do for North-
ern Ontario," he said, "but I do as-
sure you that any commitments fairly
made by the previous government
will be carried through." In closing,
Mr. Hay suggested that Mac Lang was
better acquainted with this district
than the other candidates, and urged
all to elect Mac Lang on June 25th.
Mr. Mac Lang received a warm
greeting and made a rapid fire ad-
dress. Mr. Lang, like some of the
other speakers of the evening, showed
how the North Land has been defrauded
out of 5 or 6 additional members
by the failure to pass the Redistribu-
tion Bill. He blamed the Government
for neglecting to bring the measure
down sooner or failing to keep the
session going till it was passed. Also
he gave some of the blame to the
blocking tactics of the Conservatives.
Mr. Lang then went into the realm of
prophecy, making forecasts giving Co-
chrane riding to himself, most of the
North Land ridings to the Liberals,
and making Mr. Hay the Premier after
June 25th.
The meeting closed with the singing
of the National Anthem.
