**MAPS OF ROUYN TOWNSHIP, QUEBEC AND VICINITY**

The Geological Survey has just published two maps on a scale of one mile to one inch of a part of north-western Quebec lying east of the gold producing area of Ontario. These maps should prove of great value to prospectors engaged in the search for gold on the Quebec side of the line. One of the sheets includes the western part of Rouyn township. Copies may be had on application to the Director, Geological Survey, Ottawa.

**\$3,000 PRIZES OFFERED FOR ESSAYS ON FAR NORTH**

According to information given to the press, four prizes totalling \$3,000, are offered for the best essays on the general subject of "Canada North of the Fifty-sixth Parallel of Latitude," by Sir James Aikins, Lieutenant-Governor of Manitoba; Sir William Price, of Quebec and Mr. A. J. T. Taylor, of Toronto, under conditions as announced herewith.

There are two competitions. The first, known as the University competition is open only to Canadian students enrolled in Canadian universities. For the second, known as the general competition, all resident Canadians are eligible.

For the best essay in the university competition there will be a cash prize of \$1,000 given by Sir James Aikins, and for the best essay in the general competition a cash prize of \$1,000 given by Sir William Price. In both competitions there will be a second prize of \$500 donated by A. J. T. Taylor.

These competitions have been instituted as a stimulus to the collection and dissemination of practical information about what are perhaps erroneously called the "Barren Lands" of the far Canadian North. It is the hope of the donors that the winning essays will pronounce an authority or impossibility of the settlement and economic exploitation of these Arctic and sub-Arctic regions. There is an old view that these areas are uninhabitable. There is a new view supported by facts of exploration, and by the northern trend of civilization in the north temperate zones that they can support population, that they constitute a new field for Canadian expansion. The donors desire a critical examination of these conflicting theories.

**FORMER NELLIE LAKE MAN GIVEN SIX MONTH TERM**

Walter J. Ward, formerly a merchant at Nellie Lake, was last week sentenced to six months in jail, being found guilty on the charge of the seduction of a 15-year-old girl, who had been employed in the store. Ward is a married man. He paid the parents of the girl \$300.00 some months ago, but, according to what came out at the trial, he thought he had been helped up when he found that the parents went on a trip down south after the money was paid over. In consequence of this feeling of annoyance, he suggested that the mother who had taken the money from him might be up against legal troubles. As a counter reply to this suggestion, the charge was laid against Ward, and despite an eloquent plea in his behalf by his counsel, Mr. W. A. Gordon, Ward was sentenced to the jail term as noted above. The reply of the parents to the suggestion that the money mentioned by Ward had been used for them to take a trip was to the effect that the trip was made necessary by the fact that the father's teeth needed attention, and that the journey and operation had been planned without any thought of the money from Ward.

**DEATH OF WM. C. WOOLLINGS AT CONNAUGHT, SATURDAY**

All who knew him will be greatly shocked and grieved to learn of the sudden death at Connaught on Saturday last, June 9th, of Mr. William Charles Woollings, resident manager at Connaught for the T. S. Woollings Company. The late Mr. Woollings was born in Toronto on Jan. 25th, 1877, and so was just a few months past forty-six years of age at the time of his death. He was a son of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Woollings, of Toronto. He had been resident manager of the Woollings Company from 1920 to the time of his death. His genial disposition endeared him to all who came in contact with him, and he had wide circles of friends throughout the North Land. His death will be a genuine source of sorrow to large numbers by whom he was regarded very highly for his many sterling characteristics. Death was due to chronic Bright's disease, though Mr. Woollings was only ill about an hour and a half before he passed away. The late Mr. Woollings is survived by a widow, as well as other near relatives, including Mr. T. S. Woollings, head of the firm of T. S. Woollings & Co., who is a brother. The remains were shipped to Toronto on Sunday for interment.
