**PAPERMAKERS WIN SECOND LEAGUE GAME AT FALLS**

**Big Come-Back Staged in Final Frame. Fielding of McLean and Batting of Brydge and Tait Features.**

In making one of the greatest come-backs ever staged on a northern diamond, the Papermakers started a terrific batting spree in the dying moments of the game at the Falls last Wednesday. Six hits, coupled with two walks, netted the Falls six runs. Timmins started off nicely in the opening frame by sending three runners across the plate on a fielder's choice, a triple by Tait, and two errors by Gauthier. The Falls scored one in their half and the Miners tallied two more in their half of the second, and then brought their total set to 8 in the seventh. With two out they started a batting spell, Tait leading off with a single, followed by a two-bagger from Fournier's bat, and a single by Abrams and a mis-play by Coons.

The Miners seemed to have the game pretty well sewed up, and many of the fans started to leave the grounds. Then the Papermakers tallied twice in the 8th innings, and with two out in the final frame, Gordie Spence seemed to lose control. He walked two men and Anson came through with a single, followed by slashing triples by Brydge and Little and singles by Morrison and Desrosier.

McIntyre caught a very good game all the way through, and held a swell chance to put the old ball game on ice in the ninth, but for a brief moment or so he seemed to lose his baseball memory and with Flanders on third and Gratton on first, and two out, he allowed Gratton to steal second without being played upon.

Tait's playing at first was very good, and he showed the natives of the Paper Town how that position should be played in big league style. He accepted fifteen chances perfectly, and grabbed at three hits in four times up, including a triple.

Dunc McLean is without a doubt the greatest infielder in amateur baseball. His fielding and throwing was nothing short of marvellous. Lynch at second and big boy Fournier at third played a creditable game and the infield showed a big improvement over the previous game. The outfield could be improved upon. Bill Pierce, Chas Sheehan and some others might be mentioned as big improvements for the outer-gardens.

Bill Brydge had a big day with the bat, slamming out a triple, a double and two singles in five times up. Gauthier at short, after three errors, was replaced by old man Girouard, whose baseball days seem to be gone forever. Anson at bat is as dangerous as ever, but his throwing wing is showing that youth is not eternal.

It does not seem to matter who does the umpiring when the Falls is playing; they always will do some kicking and ragging. The decisions on the bases were apparently fair and just, yet the Falls found fault.

In spite of losing the first two games the Miners are by no means disheartened, and are out to win the next game. The fans should turn out in numbers to witness the next struggle.

Timmins—Spence singled. McIntyre sacrificed him along. Monaghan struck out. Lynch kicked the batted ball and was out. 0 runs, 1 hit, 0 errors.

Abrams singled, scoring Fournier, Abrams going to second on the throw-in to the plate. Coons fumbled. Spence's grounder, Abrams scoring. McIntyre's grounder forced Spence at 2nd. 3 runs, 3 hits, 1 error.

Falls—Abrams took care of Morrison's fly. Desrosier safe on McLean's low throw. Desrosier stole second. Flanders out, Spence to Tait. Girouard out, Fournier to Tait. 0 runs, 0 hits, 1 error.

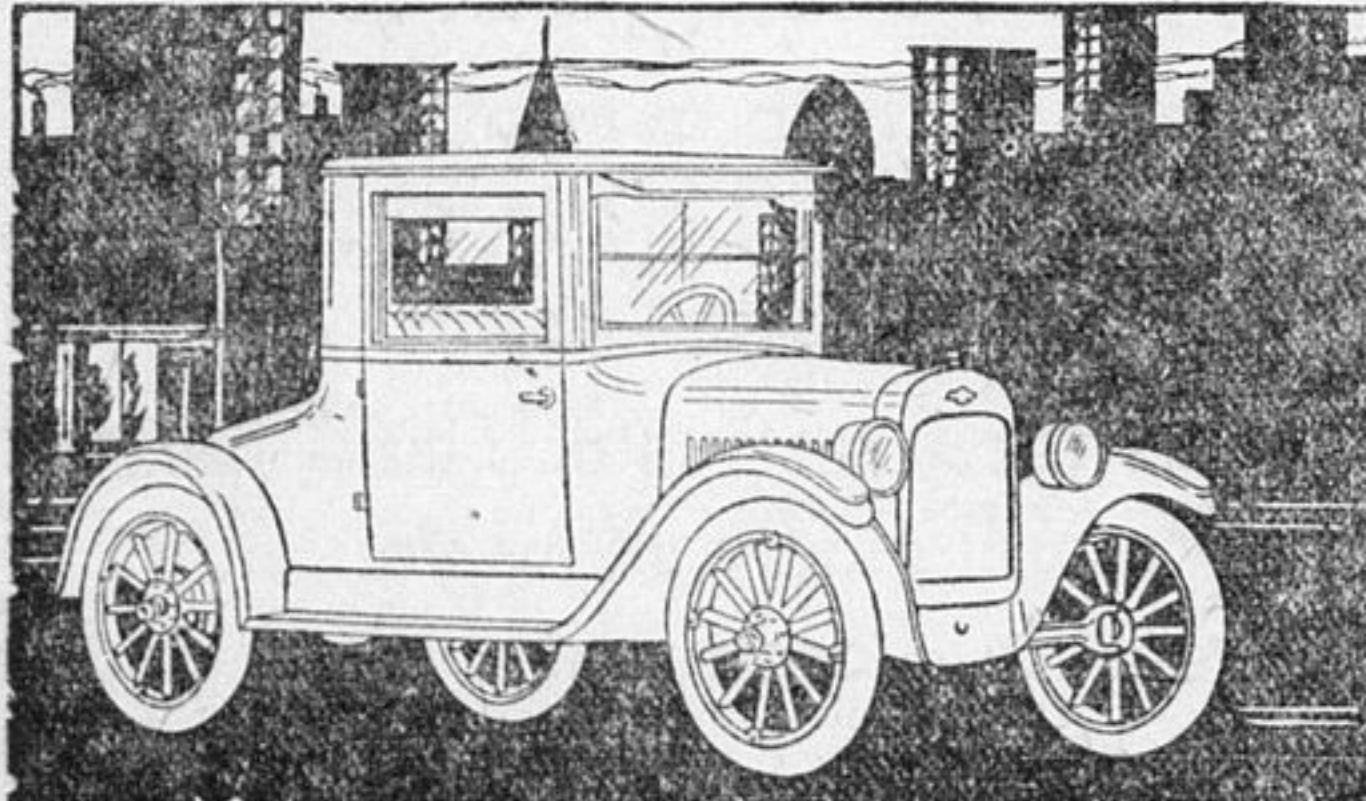
