FIRE RANGERS TO BE KEPT ON DUTY UNTIL NEXT MONTH

Despite the frequent rains that have practically eliminated the probability of serious forest fires in the North Land the new Government of Ontario has decided not to withdraw the fire rangers until some time along in October. The Government this year is not taking any chances. There may be a temptation on the part of some up in this country to say with some irony, "Oh, yes, the Government will spend money this year in keeping men on when it is not necessary, while last year the rangers were taken off just at the time they were most needed. That's always the way with Governments." In reply to this, it may be said that Governments are seldom any worse than the people who elected them, and that the Government this year is an altogether different type of Government than that of last year, the inference being that the people have improved considerably in perception and interest in the meantime. The present Government is simply making assurance doubly sure that false economy in the matter of fire protection is not going to cause deplorable loss this year as it did last October in this North Land. The previous Government "took a chance," and the country had a serious loss as a consequence. The present Government is not taking chances when the lives and property of the people are at stake. There is no room for any fair or reasonable citizen to do anything else than commend the Government for this.

A good feature for the Porcupine Fair on September 27th would be a pack of the Toronto Star's North Land Wolves. People up here would like to see them. Many here (even among old-timers) have never been able to get close enough to any wolves to see what they are like. Perhaps The Star would oblige by sending up a pack or two by parcel post. But even if The Star and the boy from the wilds of Cincinnati fall down on this assignment, the Porcupine Fair will still have a big list of special attractions. For instance these is to be the big showing of spectacular gold ore. Gold is more frequent in the North Land than the wolf pack. Also, easier to find and see.
