### PAPER INDUSTRIES MUST ANCHOR PULP FORESTS

The following is written by Mr. Geo. Chahoon, Jr., President of the Laurentide Company, Grand Mere, Quebec:—

It is sometimes carelessly said that the pulp and paper industry's chief concern is an immediate supply of pulpwood without regard to the future. A moment's thought will show how suicidal such a policy would be for the modern conception of pulp and paper making, the financing of a company, the construction of its massive and immovable mills is predicated upon continuous operation over a long period of time. Unlike the portable saw mill operator, the paper manufacturer cannot pack his kit and follow up the retreating forest. He must anchor his forest as securely as he anchors his mill dam. He must have a permanent forest supply if he is to have a permanent public confidence in the securities of his company and permanent dividends for his shareholders. There is not a responsible officer of a Canadian pulp and paper corporation who today is not ready to support any reasonable scheme of proper management of the forest resources. Hundreds of millions of investors' money are staked on mammoth plants which in turn are of no more productive value than the forest resources that stand behind them. Let it be understood, however, that it is not the logging crews that devastate forests, but the reckless Canadian citizen whose fires clean off year by year more timber than all the companies could cut down. Fire is the arch enemy of the pulp and paper industry and to put the forest fire out of business is the primary and unrivalled measure in any policy of permanent forests.

### SCHUMACHER AUDIENCE PLEASED WITH CHORUS

Timmins Male Chorus Gave Excellent Musical Festival In McIntyre Hall Last Thursday.

The Musical Festival, under the auspices of the Timmins Male Chorus, held in the McIntyre Recreation Hall, Schumacher, on Thursday evening last, Sept. 20th, was an outstanding and noteworthy event from a musical standpoint. The event was not as largely attended as it would have been had there been more time for effective publicity, but the audience made up in appreciation for any lack in numbers, and financially the event was also satisfactory.

The programme was one of unusual interest and every item was presented in a manner that delighted all lovers of music present. One item on the printed programmes—the quartette, "Kentucky Babe" by Messrs. Street, Dodge, Moore and Skelly,—had to be omitted, owing to the illness of Messrs. Street and Skelly. The rest of the programme was given in full as printed, and proved specially pleasing. Among the special numbers on the programme worthy of more than passing notice were the solos by Mr. W. R. Dodge and Mr. J. T. Heffernan, and the piano duet by Mrs. J. W. Faithful and Mr. R. R. Johnston. The monologue, "By the Yukon Trail," by Mr. A. J. Downie, was rendered with much effectiveness and proved one of the popular numbers on the evening's programme. In response to a recall he gave a solo that also caught the fancy of the audience. Mr. W. R. Dodge's voice was heard to advantage in the solo, "Oh, I have Sighed to Rest Me," and his sympathetic interpretation of this selection was much appreciated. Mr. Heffernan's solo part in "Killarney," was exceptionally well taken, while in the solo, "Oh, Moon of My Delight," he made another decided hit with the audience. The piano duet by Mrs. Faithful and Mr. Johnston was a genuine delight to the music lovers present. The Timmins Male Chorus, under the leadership of Mr. R. R. Johnston, lived up to the high reputation they have won on merit as a chorus of outstanding ability. Among the selections by the Chorus were:—"The Beleaguered," "Alexander," "The Long Day Closes," "Killarney," "Border Ballad," "Soldier's Chorus from Faust," "The World is Waiting for the Sunrise," "Bells of St. Mary's." At the opening, "O, Canada," was effectively rendered, while at the close of the excellent entertainment the Chorus led in "God Save the King."

After the event the ladies of Schumacher entertained the members of the Chorus to luncheon, light refreshments being served and all enjoying a pleasant social time.
