The figures for attendance are given to bring very forcibly before the parents the necessity for sending their children to school regularly and have them arrive there punctually.

On an average there have been 34 pupils absent every day or enough for one whole class. There was an average of 12 half-day attendances every day and an average of 13 lates every day. This is a very deplorable state of affairs and good work in the schools is impossible under these conditions. This past month has been no exception, as the school registers for preceding months show a similar record.

It is not the duty of the School Attendance Officer to chase around after absentee children but it is his

duty to bring parents to account who are negligent in regard to having their children attend regularly. The school law requires the attendance every day of all children from six to sixteen years of age and the parents and guardians are held responsible for failure in complying with the requirements.

The Public School Board have endeavored to provide sufficient accommodation, necessary equipment and a well-qualified staff of teachers and it is the intention to enforce the regulations so that when the children leave school they will be as well prepared as possible to undertake their duties as citizens.

It is earnestly hoped that no drastic action may be necessary but a marked improvement should be in evidence without delay.

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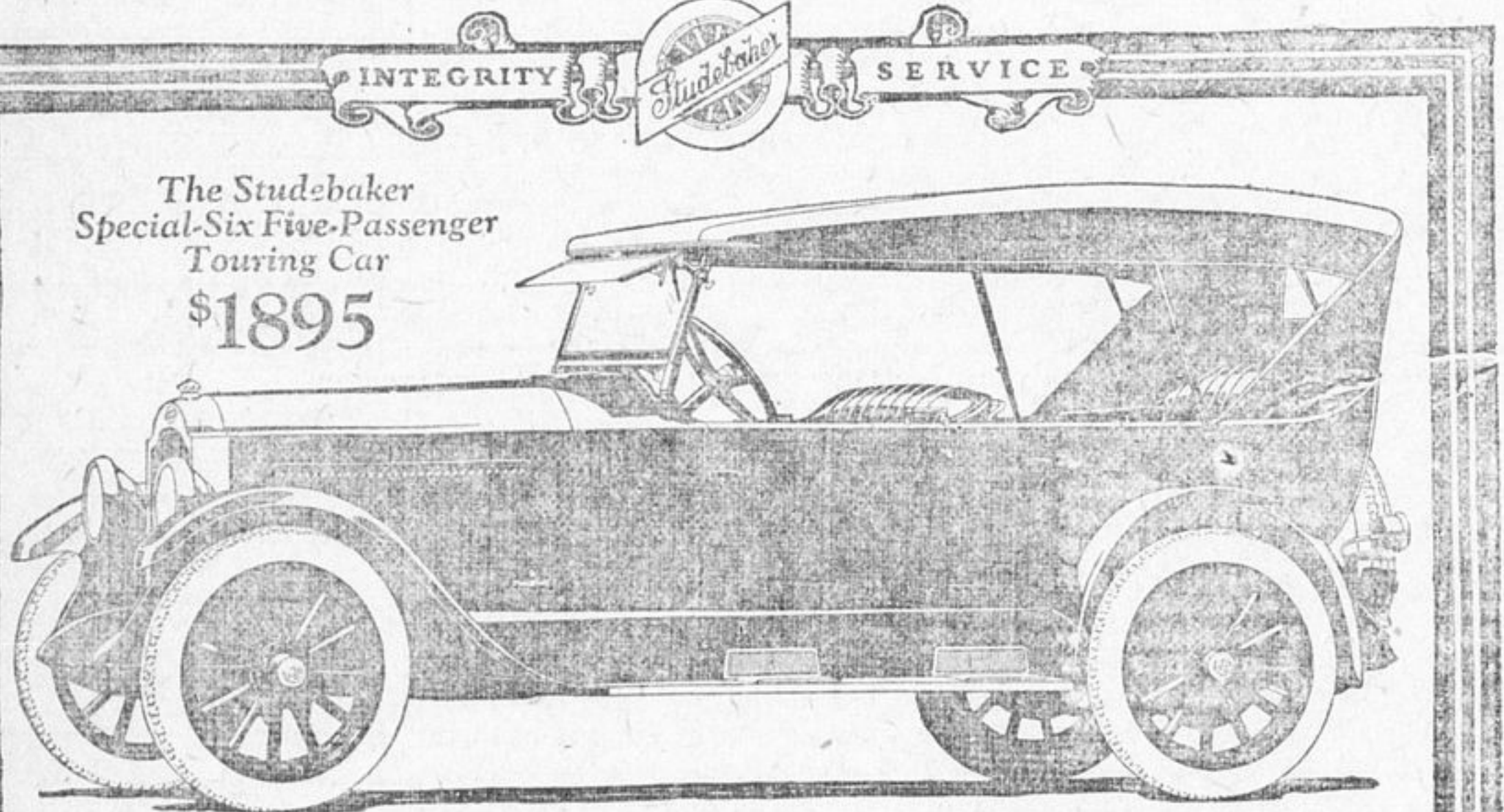
