NEW BISHOP OF DIOCESE A LEADER IN EDUCATION

Bishop Rheaume Comes from Out of the Real "First Families" of Canada. Has Remarkable Administrative Talent.

The Right Rev. Louis Rheaume whose consecration to the episcopate as Bishop of Temiskaming, took place at Ottawa on Thursday last, has devoted 18 years of his life to the cause of education, and ranks with the prominent educationalists of Canada. The capacity for administration he displayed while Rector of the University of Ottawa, from 1915 to 1921, during the difficult period of the war is said to have been a factor in his appointment on June S last to the See of Temiskaming made vacant by the death of Bishop L. A. Latulipe at Cobalt on December 14,

The new Bishop of Haileybury was born at Levis, Quebec, November 21, 1873, the son of Jeremie Rheaume, now S1 years of age. The first Rheaume to settle in Canada arrived from France in 1642. Bishop Rheaume made his classical course at the Uni versity of Ottawa, entered the Oblate Order in 1898, studied philosophy and theology at Rome, and was ordained to the priesthood at Rome by Mgr. Virilli April 2, 1904. He is a Doctor of Philosophy and Theology.

At the University of Ottawa, Bishop Rheaume was Professor of Higher Mathematics, 1905 to 1913, Director of the Grand Seminary, 1913 to 1915; Rector, 1915 to 1921, and again Director of the Grand Seminary from 1921 to 1923.

Following his consecration, his Lordship will take up temporary residence at New Liskeard. The diocese of Temiskaming is territorially the largest in Canada. It covers approximately 68,000 square miles.

On the eve of his consecration to the episcopacy, Mgr. Rheaume received today a striking tribute of affection from the student body of the University of Ottawa, of which he was rector from 1915 to 1921, and where he spent 18 years of his career. The tribute took the form of a presentation of a beautiful urn to serve as container of the holy oils used for sacramental purposes, and the reading of English and French addresses.

The English address, read by Mr. C. Mulvey, embodied an eulogistic enumeration of the salient events in Bishop Rheaume's career at the uni-

LAKE SHORE MINE SHOWS VERY SATISFACTORY YEAR

The eighth annual report of the Lake Shore Wine at Kirkland Lake shows successful operations, continued progress and improved progress at this noteworthy property. As the report is for the 19 months ending June 30, 1923, it makes a comparison with the previous year difficult. The profits for the period totaled \$168,268, and this served to cover the four dividends, which totaled \$160,000, and allowed the carrying forward of \$8,268 to apply to debit balance of \$90,293 from Dec. 1, 1921.

Ballion production for the period amounted to \$833,664, which compares with \$460,186 for the previous 12 months. This was the largest item in the income, which totaled \$865,718. Expenses are given at \$697,718. Of this the big item was \$412,559 paid out for operating, development, mining, milling, maintenance, etc. Provision for depreciation on buildings was \$63,614; for exhaustion of mine, \$190,000, and for Dominion Government taxes, \$11,799;

The assets show cash and bank balances of \$125,716, Holdings of bonds now stand at \$252,488, as against \$50,000 at the end of the previous year. Total assets amount

to \$1,329,964. The report of R. C. Coffey, mine manager, shows that 36,825 tons were treated during the period, with an average value per ton of \$22.57. Broken ore amounts to 34,700 tons, which is valued at \$801,568. Daring the period the shaft was enlarged from the surface to the fourth level, 200 feet of sinking completed, steel head-frame erected, and the doubledrum electric hoist installed. The mine now has a well-equipped threecompartment shaft in operation to the 800-foot level. Mr. Coffey points out that contracts have been awarded for the machinery necessary to increase the milling capacity to 300 tons per
