### SOUTH END FANCIERS WIN AT THE ENGLEHART SHOW

Messrs. Herb. Sullivan and W. D. Pearce Clean Up on the Prizes for Poultry.

The Englehart Poultry Show on Wednesday and Thursday of last week attracted a good attendance. There were many noteworthy entries and the total number of birds shown was very creditable. In general, the birds were of high class. There were 154 entries, apart from turkeys, ducks and geese, the last three sections running the total to 170. The White Wyandottes led with 30 entries; the Barred Rocks were next with 27; the Rhode Island Reds came third in numbers, having 26 entries; Aneonas and White Leghorns had 15 entries each; Brown Leghorns, Silver-laced Wyandottes, Light Brahas, and other breeds were also represented.

Messrs. Herb. Sullivan and W. D. Pearce practically swept the boards in their respective classes, the birds shown by these two South Porcupine fanciers winning praise from all sides. In Barred Rocks, Mr. Sullivan won: 1st and 2nd, Cockerels; 1st, 2nd and 3rd, Pullets; Best Pair of Parti-Coloured Birds in Show; Best Barred Rock Pullet in Show; Best Young Pair of Barred Rocks in Show; Best Pair of Barred Rocks, old or young, in Show. Mr. Sullivan thus won no less than nine prizes in the class he fancies. The Judge, Mr. Wm. Carter of Londonboro, Ont., commented on the high standing of Mr. Sullivan's birds. "They are worthy of being shown at any exhibition of poultry in this country," he said.

Mr. W. D. Pearce was also very successful with his entries, carrying off four prizes for his fine birds. He won first in Cockerels, Buff Orpingtons; first and second in Pullets of the same breed; and his Buff Orpingtons were also awarded a Special as the Best Pair of their breed in the Show. The Judge remarked on Mr. Pearce's birds. "The surface colour," he said, "is as fine as I have ever seen on any bird."

Mr. H. A. Parker, of Uno Park, cleaned up pretty well on Wyandottes taking first and third in Cocks, second in Cockerels, and third in Pullets. Also a Special for Best Bird in Show, any variety, either sex.

Mr. Chas. H. Ham, Englehart, in the same class won first in Pullets, Cockerels and Hens; second in Pullets; and first in Trio. He also won Special for young Wyandotte, and for Best Cockerel, American or Asiatic Breeds. Also, Special for largest entry in Show.

Mr. A. E. Stephenson, of New Liskeard, was the chief winner in the Rhode Island Reds. He won first in Hens and Cockerels and third in Pullets. Also, Special for the Best Cockerel in Show, and for the Best Hen in Show. Mr. C. Fennell, of Englehart, was also a good winner in the Rhode Island Reds.

Mr. P. Pillsworth, of Englehart, made a pretty good clean-up in the White Leghorn class, winning two firsts, four seconds, three thirds and four Specials.

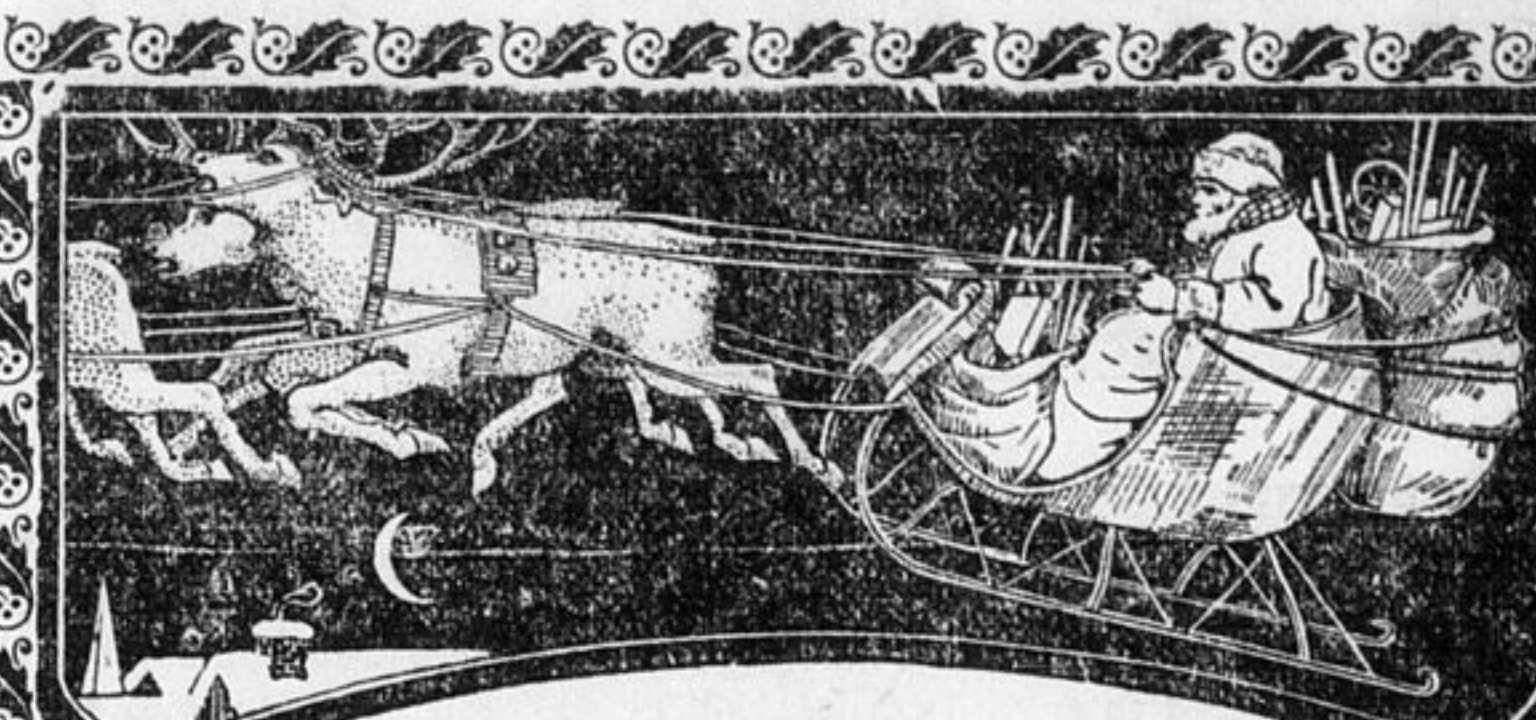

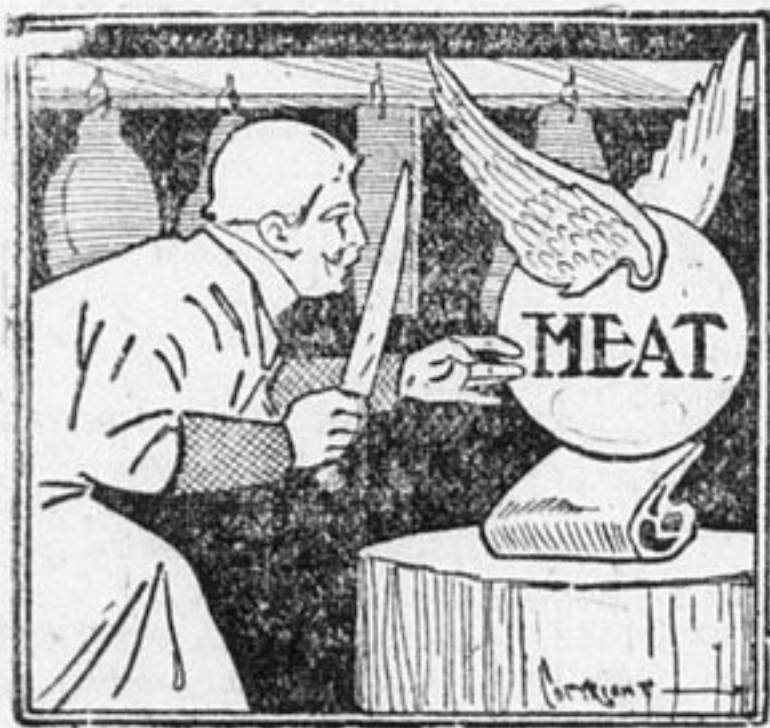

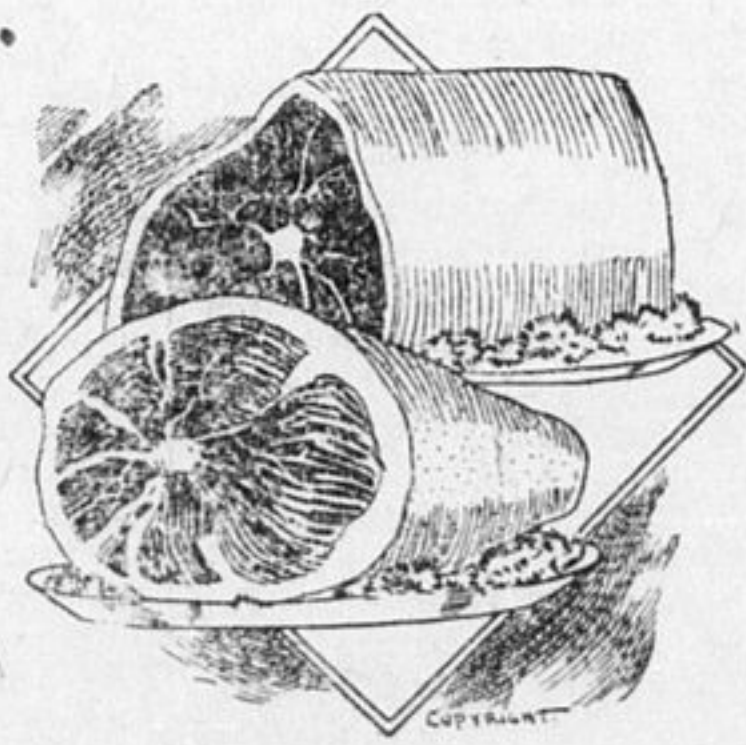

### TWO LAKES TO BE OPENED FOR MINING PURPOSES

The Provincial Cabinet at a Council meeting last week decided to open up the beds of Porcupine and Simpson Lakes for mining development. The properties will be sold by tender next spring. This involves the sale of the land under the lakes, and not exposure of the property by drainage. It is understood that probable buyers will prospect their purchases by tunnelling from shafts driven through shore properties.

### MINING IN NORTH LAND GOOD FOR CENTURIES

"The mines, which have already been discovered, will doubtless be working for generations," said J. B. Tyrell, E.M., recently, in discussing Northern Ontario's mining possibilities. "In addition to these, considering the great extent of the covered and unprospected areas of Pre-Cambrian rocks relative to the prospected areas, and the possibilities of these covered and unprospected areas for containing ore, I am quite confident that many more rich mines will yet be discovered and that Northern Ontario may be depended upon as a great mining country for centuries to come."
