

FORMER T. & N.O. OPERATOR BROUGHT BACK FOR TRIAL

Joseph Gillice, operator on the T & N.O. Railway at Englehart at the time of the fatal wreck at Dane last summer, has been brought back from the south for trial. Newspaper reports are conflicting as to where he was at the time of his arrest, one despatch saving he was at Bridgeburg and another mentioning Buffalo. Gillice, these despatches agree in stating, is held responsible by the Canadian authorities for the disastrous wreck at Dane on August 28th, in which accident three trainmen lost their lives. At the inquest following the tragedy, Gillice admitted that he had failed to give a train crew a copy of one of the orders received by him, and it was generally considered that this failure to give out orders had. contributed to the occurrence of the wreck. The despatcher at North Bay was questioned as to whether he had fully checked up on the orders sent Englehart. Eventually warrants were issued for the arrest of the North Bay operator on duty at the time of the wreck, and for Gillice, the operator at Englehart. The charge against the despatcher was later dropped, and he was recently reinstated in the service of the T. & N.O. Gillice in the meantime had left the North Land. At various times questions have been asked in regard to the matter, in the public press and otherwise. On each occasion the Crown authorities said that the matter was being kept under notice and that there was no intention of dropping the case against Gillice. The operator is charged "with criminal negligence and will be given a preliminary hearing this week,


