OVER \$20,230 TAKEN IN BY POLICE DEPT IN YEAR.

The official figures show that for the year just closing the Police Department took in a total of \$20,232 in fines, costs and fees. This covers the period January 1st to Dec. 27th, 1923. The Timmins Police Department is not only self-sustaining, but is a regular money-maker for the town, as well as being effective in keeping the municipality in the best of peace and order. After considering the report of the Police Chief for the year, the Town Council might well be tempted to order the motor car that the Chief of Police has asked for to assist in the better policing of this large and rapidly-growing town.

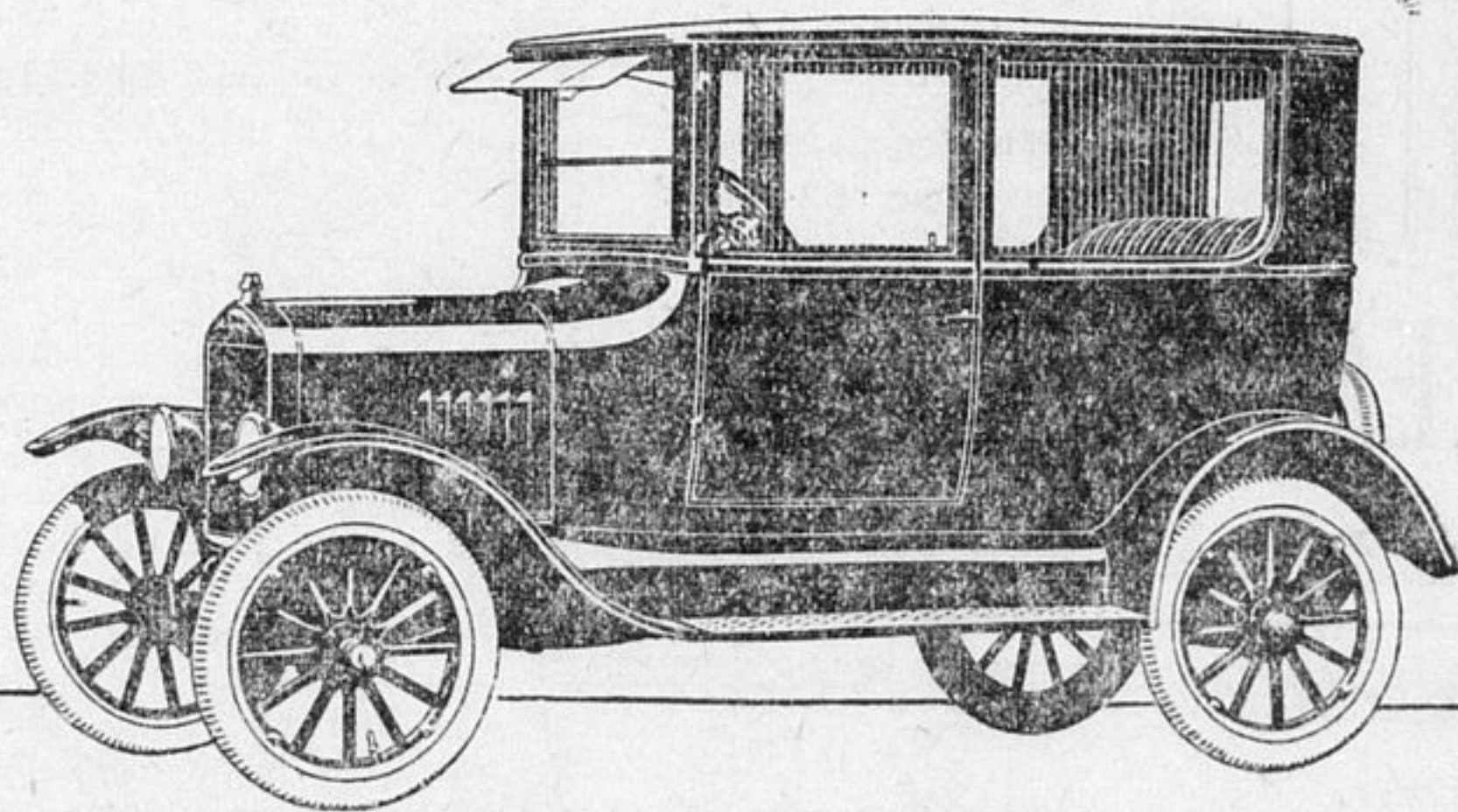
