## SAULT WINS SECOND GAME AT THE FALLS, SCORE 5-3

Game Was Sprinkled With Penalties. Three Men Injured. Game a Good One to Watch.

With the line-up of both teams the same as on Thursday night, the Sault Ste. Marie Greyhounds on Friday reversed the decision of Thursday evening, when they defeated the Falls Papermakers to the tune of 5-3, in a game which showed better hockey than that of the night before. About one hundred and fifty went over from Timmins and the district to witness this game, and all felt as though they had gotten their money's worth in good hockey, from gong to gong. Mike Rodden of Toronto again handled the game, and while he did not get everything, he was pretty fair.

The first period opened with frequent off-sides, the referee catching them all. Donnelly lost at the Falls defence, Woodruff repeating the same performance. After some close checking, Woodruff again came down, and sent a long one in on Byrne which trickled past the papermakers' goalie, making the Sault's first counter. Donnelly and Brown both came down, but lost at the defence. Fournier and Roos going down, and nearly getting one past Flat Walsh. Byrne made a lucky save, when Lessard sent a hot one in. Lafrance tried a long one on the Sault net which went wild. The play remained at the Falls-end for the next few seconds, Byrne making some nice saves. Lessard went through and missed an open net. Fahey again drew the first penalty for boarding Phillips. Byrne made a nice save on a shot from Lessard, clearing to Bellefeuille, who went down, passed to Chirooski who sent in the first for the Papermakers. Bellefeuille was sent to goal for boarding Lessard. The Falls were now two men short and Donnelly came down alone, sent a long one at Byrne, which the Papermaker goalie did not see, making the second counter for the Greyhounds. Lessard drew a warning for loafing off-side, he being quite an adept at this sort of play. Lessard again tried to get past Byrne, but could not make it, being hurt right after and carried off the ice. Boucher went down, but Walsh was there with the goods. Woodruff came down, and sent in the third counter for the Greyhounds. Donnelly went off for tripping. Brown lost at the Falls defence. Fahey tried a long one at Walsh, but it was only a try. Fournier went to the box for a rest. The play was very fast at this period, both teams checking close. Walsh made a lucky save, and passed to Brown. The Greyhounds were playing a nicer game than on Thursday night, and checking the Falls closely. The play switched to the Falls end, Byrne being called on to make some nice

saves. Phillips went to the box for interference. Chirooski went down, and sent in the Falls second counter, going to the penalty box right after Lessard sent a hot one in, Byrne making a nice save. Donnelly came down, went through the tri-coloured defence, and had only Byrne to beat, but he didn't. The gong rang with the Sault one goal up.

The second period opened with Fahey getting one in on Walsh, Flat saving. Lessard was again caught loafing off-side. Woodruff got two in quick succession in on Byrne which the Papermaker was lucky to save. The checking was closer in this period, neither team being able to get much combination going. The play remained in mid-ice for a few seconds. Chirooski went to the box for boarding Phillips. While he was off the Greyhounds pressed hard, but they could not get away. Donnelly nearly got one past Byrne, who shot the puck out to Fournier, the big fellow going down, and the play was at the Sault end for the next few seconds. Lessard and Woodruff both shot too high. Cook was sent off for interference. Donnelly and Boucher each had a shot on their respective opponents, but the disc in both cases did not cross the line. Fahey went down to the Sault end lost the puck, and started back, Cook slipping the puck into his own net, where none of the tri-coloured boys could get it. This made the Falls third counter. Brown went down, and succeeded in besting the Falls defence, but he could not pass goal. Bellefeuille was hurt and had to be carried off. Boucher was sent to the box for boarding Brown. Roos was hurt near the Soo net, and had to be carried off. Fournier was sent to the box for interference. The Falls were two men short now, and Byrne made two nice saves, Phillips sending one in which the Papermaker had no chance to save, this made the Sault's fourth. The period ended with the score Falls 3, Sault 4.

Bellefeuille got the first shot in on Walsh, and after some close checking the Papermakers broke away, and got in on the Sault net, but were called back, Boucher being off-side right in front of the net. The play slowed down some, Walsh coming in for a regular bombardment right after. Lessard broke away, went in and with only Byrne to beat shot wild. He threw his stick over the wire, to help him express his chagrin. Brown came

down and on a lone effort sent in the Greyhounds' fifth counter. Campbell was sent to the box for a rest, Boucher going off for slashing. Bellefeuille joining him right after, when he threw his stick to save a goal. The Falls were three men short now. The Greyhounds even at that could not get one past Byrne, Brown went off for tripping Bellefeuille. Fournier going off again for tripping. Lessard went off for slashing. The play was rougher now, and Referee Rodden was handing out the penalties to both

sides. Walsh was called to make some wonderful saves, the Papermakers working hard, but they could not find a place in the net that Walsh was not there waiting for them. Fournier went off again for tripping. Lessard sent a wicked one in which Byrne saved, right after Walsh made a nice save. Fahey went off when he mixed it with Brown. Brown sent one in, which made the fifth counter for the Sault. The gong rang with the Greyhounds two goals up on the Papermakers.

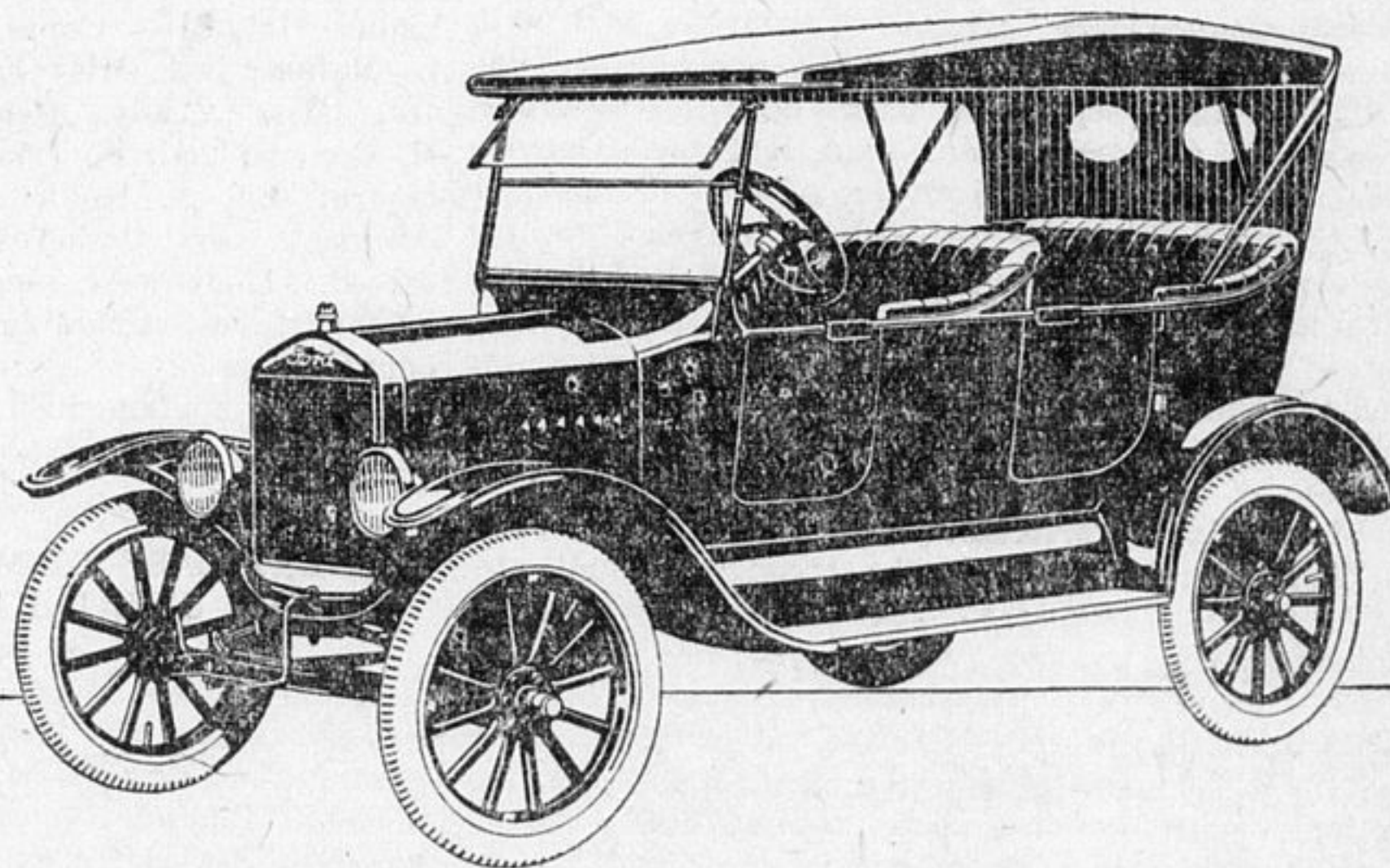

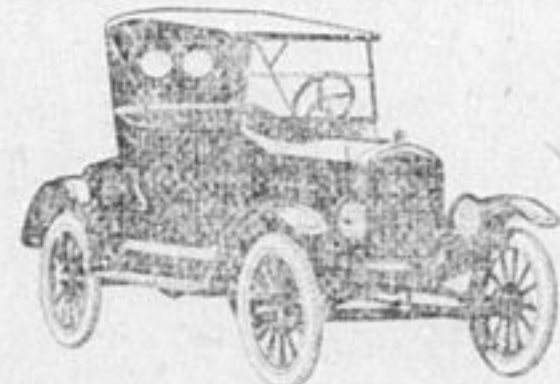
