

VIPONO PRODUCTION WAS \$53,500.00 IN JANUARY

Physical Condition Largely Improved in Last Six Months. Pleasing Report Issued.

At the Vipond Mine in January this year production was \$53,500.00, as compared with \$24.946.00 for December, according to a report of J MacIntosh Bell, consulting engineer of the Company. The report states that during the last six months the physical condition of the Vipond Mines has continued to improve, largely through the opening up of substantial reserves on veins Nos. 9. 10, 12 and 14 in the central part of the property. The ore reserves, which were estimated at 210,885 tons of an average grade of \$6.62, or a gross value of \$1,396,058 on July 15, had risen to 256,981 tons of an average grade of \$10.19, or a gross value of \$2,618,636, on November 15. Since this date comparatively little actual new development work has been in progress, the mining operations consisting largely in the widening of the known ore bodies to the walls and in stope preparation. The mill, which commenced operations in December, began working early in January on a daily capacity of about 150 tons of material of normal grade.

A statement of receipts and expenditures shows a balance on hand on August 1, 1923, of \$6,098. Receipts from August 1, 1923, to January 31, 1924, are as follows: Sale of stock, \$198,351.20; sale of gold, \$42,538.23; exchange earned, \$1,165.35; sundry debtors, \$745.20. Total receipts, \$242,799.98 making a total amount of cash for the six months of \$248,898.85. The expenditure was \$212,203.06, leaving a balance on January 31 of \$36,695.79. Capital expenditure for the six months was \$59,692.72.

DEATH OF ARTHUR JOWSEY WELL-KNOWN PROSPECTOR

J. Arthur Jowsey, a well-known prospector of the North Land, died last week in Toronto General Hospital following an operation for intestinal trouble. He was a native of Aylmer, Quebec, and was only 37 years of age at the time of death. He had spent several years prospecting in the North Land. He made the original find on the Kirkland Lake Gold Mines property and was one of the real discoverers of the Kirkland Lake field. He served overseas with the Canadian Engineers, being one of eight brothers all of whom gave military service to the Empire in the late war. His widow (formerly Miss Georgina Haig) is among the near relatives surviving.)
