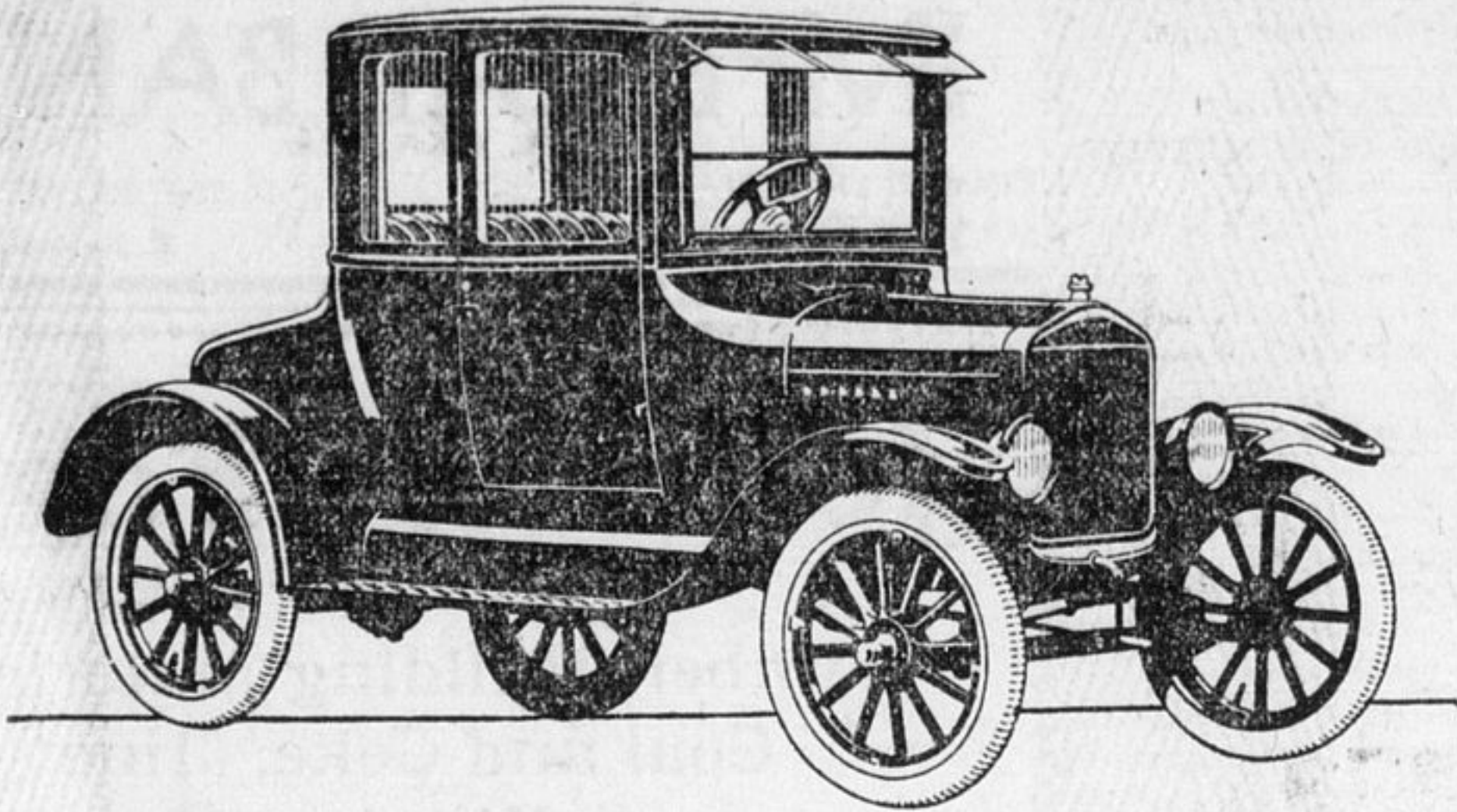
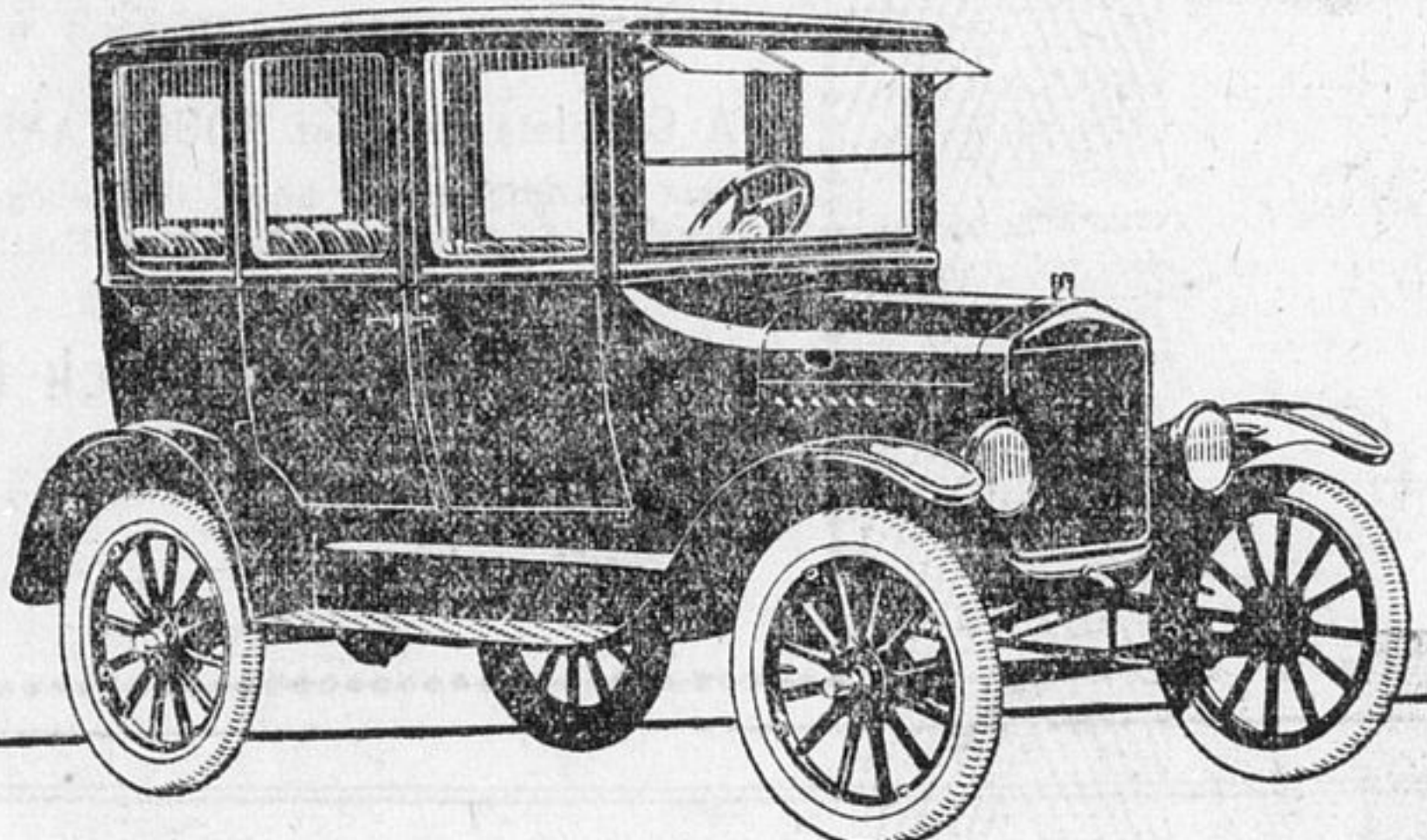

SAULT GREYHOUNDS CHAMPIONS OF N.O.H.A.

Four hundred and fifty fans from the town of Timmins and along the line journeyed over to Iroquois Falls last Saturday evening to see the first game of the second series when the Papermakers went down to defeat for the third time before the Sault Ste. Marie Greyhounds. The game was a fast one, the victory belonging to either team until the final gong when the Sault left the ice, the victors by a score of 2-1.

The second game of the series played on Monday night showed a better brand of hockey, than that of Saturday, the first two periods seeing both teams putting up the same kind of good hockey. The final gong rang with the Sault at the long end of a two to one score. About one hundred went over from Timmins to witness this game.
