**TWO MEN CHARGED WITH ROBBERY AT GRAY'S STORE**

On Feb. 4th Gray's Drug Store at Mattagami was broken into and a bottle of alcohol and a box of soap stolen. Last week the police took their final steps in solving this case, and from the evidence secured and the admissions made by the men now accused, this case is apparently in the solved column. Earl Caron and Neil Bell will face charges in police court this week in connection with this little robbery. Bell, who was sentenced to a prison term last week on the charge of being a frequenter of a disorderly house, has been held over here for trial on the shop-breaking charge. Earl Caron last week was fined \$50.00 and costs for frequenting

a disorderly house. This week he will face another charge in connection with the robbery of Gray's Drug Store. According to the story now told the men used a hammer to smash the glass in the door so as to be able to reach in and unlock the door. They worked in the dark, and were particularly anxious to get some cigarettes. Grabbing a box of what they thought was packages of cigarettes, and a jar of alcohol, about 1/2 gallon, and not forgetting to take what was in the till, some \$15.00, the men left for their abode, only to discover that what they thought was cigarettes was only soap—hard luck.
