**URGES "STOCK-TAKING"**  
**ONTARIO'S FOREST LANDS**

Mr. E. W. Neelands Tells Land Surveyors of Waste of Timber in North Land, and Suggests Remedies.

According to the Toronto daily newspapers last week the outstanding address at the annual convention of the Ontario Land Surveyors' Association was that given by Mr. E. W. Neelands, of the firm of Sutcliffe & Neelands, New Liskeard. Not only had Mr. Neelands a subject of particular public importance but he dealt with it in a very effective and helpful manner. His theme was: "Reforestation as I See It in Northern Ontario." With an imposing array of facts and figures interestingly presented, he pointed a striking picture of the present timber situation in Northern Ontario. According to the reports as given in the newspapers, Mr. Neelands pointed out that in addition to the enormous yearly consumption of wood and wood products by Canadian mills, and the great quantities shipped from freehold lands to the United States, it must be remembered, that the waste from fire was twenty townships a year and destruction by armies of insects and by disease probably almost as great. Within a few years practically all the balsam in Temiskaming and Western Quebec would be dead, and with it much of the spruce, either because of the ravages of the same disease or owing to the spruce gall or bud-worm. He suggested that the Ontario Department of Lands and Forests might be well advised to call in the services of the Ontario Land Surveyors' Association in assisting the Forestry Department to save the accessible virgin timber, protect the second growth already started, and plant out new forests. Five new forest nurseries, planting 10,000 acres annually were necessary—the first cost to be \$100,000, annual maintenance \$50,000, and the annual cost of planting \$150,000. At the end of sixty years there would be, as a result, an annual production of 400 million board feet of lumber, or 50 million more than is cut now.

Mr. Neelands believed that at this session of Parliament funds should be voted to commence a classification or "stock-taking" of Ontario's northern lands for the purpose of determining the amount of tillable land, the amount of sand, muskeg and barren land. Having arrived at the portion thought to be suitable for tree planting, a staff should be employed the year round, cutting isolated patches of mature timber, clearing by fire at proper times "slash" or dead timber and its army of wood destroyers, protecting seed trees and planting out new seedlings. Above all things, the thousands of patches of "slash" or dry muck found in Northern Ontario must be cleaned away, if for no other reason than to prevent fire.

In once more bringing forcibly to general attention the question of Ontario's forest wealth and the need for thought and study and action by all that this wealth may be conserved, Mr. Neelands has conferred a decided benefit upon the North Land.

**PORCUPINE-DAVIDSON SHAFT**  
**NOW DOWN ABOUT 400 FEET**

The stock of the Porcupine-Davidson Gold Mine was called last week for trading on the Standard Mining Exchange and co-incident with this was the announcement made at Toronto that work at the property is now largely concentrated upon the sinking of the new three compartment shaft. This shaft is already down about 400 feet, and is designed to connect with the main ore body—located by drilling—at 1,000 feet. At the 550-ft. level a station will be established and a cross-cut driven to the old workings, from which five levels, all in ore, have been driven. While the sinking of the new shaft is continued the ore in these levels will be blocked out in readiness for the mill; and mill plans will be decided upon as soon as the 1,000-ft. level is reached. The company has approximately \$390,000 cash working capital in hand.

**DEATH OF MR. J. J. STADELMAN**  
**AT COBALT LAST WEDNESDAY**

Mr. J. J. Stadelman, father of Messrs. Lawrence and Ivan Stadelman, died in Cobalt last Wednesday evening, in his 75th year. The late Mr. Stadelman had been ill for some eighteen months past and in that time had undergone specialists' treatment at Toronto and other centres. The late Mr. Stadelman was born in Switzerland, but came to Canada many years ago, settling at Shakespeare, Perth County, Ontario, when a young man, being in the employ of the Grand Trunk Railway. About 23 years ago he came to the North Land, taking up residence at New Liskeard where he lived for some nineteen years. In 1920 he went to Cobalt to reside. Five sons and five daughters survive. The sons are:—John, at Shakespeare, Ont.; Albert, of Hamilton; William, at McCool; Lawrence, at Cobalt; Ivan, at Timmins. The daughters are:—Mrs. Madden, London, Ont.; Mrs. W. Taylor, New Liskeard; Misses Bertha, Agnes and May, at home. Mrs. Stadelman predeceased her husband some thirteen years ago. Mr. Lawrence Stadelman is well-known and popular in Timmins, having conducted a book and stationery store here for some time in connection with his brother, Ivan, who now conducts a stationery and music store here on Pine street. To the surviving relatives the sympathy of all will go out in their loss. The late Mr. Stadelman was highly esteemed and respected by all who knew him and for nearly a quarter of a century he was a valued citizen of the New North.

The funeral took place on Friday afternoon last week, service being held at St. Patrick's R.C. church, Cobalt, Rev. Fr. O'Gorman officiating, and interment being made at New Liskeard cemetery.


