



G.A. What chance, according to this ruling, has a young fellow who plays a phenomenal game of golf, but who cannot afford to belong to a club?

"The professional golfers of this province should er

province hold a closed tournament. Why should the O.A.G.A. hold one, too? If the golfers of this province are unable to hold their own against outside competition, let them be beatn. Let the best man win.

"Holding an 'open' tournament the way the O.A.G.A. held one last year does not fully serve the purpose it is intended to in the developing of. golf, but, on the other hand, shuts out many golfers who should be eligible to compete.

"While I am opposed to the way the tournament was held, I wish to say a word about the club it was held on. Never have I seen a club extend to visiting competitors, either amateur or professional, more courtesy than was extended by the club whereon the tournament was held, and al the members of the executive of that club and of the O.A.G.A. are deserving of the highest praise for this branch of their labours. "Another cause of the under-development of golf in this province is the class of instruction golfers have been receiving. A year ago, I opened my golf school (and it is still running), and during the time it has been open golfers have come to me who have had lessons from professionals in this province, and they had not even been taught the proper way to hold the

"There are five correct grips out of which the maximum degree of hit ting power can be obtained. There are several other grips that are not so good. One or other of the five grips can be applied to any golfer, depending on the size of his hand, length of arm, etc. The average golf instructor can be excused from being unable to analyze a golf swing with its many complicated parts, but there is no excuse for him not teaching one or other of the correct grips.

"There is an instructor hereabouts who has been teaching a grip which will never permit those who are struggling with it to get beyond the dub class. There are thundreds of golfers dubbing round the golf courses of this province who have been taught wrong. The more these poor souls play the worse they will get. Some golf lessons are cheap at \$5 and others are dear at fifty cents:

"With the single exception of Willie Campbeli I have never seen a firstclass player who was a first-class instructor. While on the other hand, none of the first-class instructors are first-class players. Getting your pu pils to play well and then to go out and play as Vardon does is impossible. Teaching breaks up a professional's game.

"This last winter has seen an epidemie of golf schools started in this city. They have been opened in cellars, atties, parlors and back kitch-
