CHARGES OF BREACH O.T.A. AND OBSTRUCTING POLICE

As a result of a police raid on the place of J. D. McMaster, rear of Cedar street, there will be charges of breaches of the O.T.A. and of obstructing the police, heard before Magistrate Atkinson to-morrow. They brought Bill, the bottles, the window ledge and the loose sheeting along to the jail. Later Bill was allowed out on \$500.00 bail. Mrs. Geneneffe Rossi is another who will be charged with keeping for sale. There is a similar charge also preferred against J. Engstrum. There are four local drivers of delivery horses summoned for breach of the law in not having weights to hold their horses when left standing.
