TIMMINS WINS AGAIN IN THE KING CUP SERIES

Dome Eleven Again Loses Out in the N.O.F.A. A Good Match Here.

On the Timmins grounds last Wednesday evening the Dome went down to their second defeat before Timmins' eleven in the King Cup series of the N.O.F.A., the score being 2 to 0.

The bad weather kept the crowd to about 200, and the rain spoiled the pitch for fast football. On the east side there was water along the touch line, with the rest of the ground very heavy going. There was a heavy shower of rain just before the match started, keeping back a good gate.

Timmins won the toss and chose to kick in the north goal.

The first goal was scored after steady pressing and Ford's good centres. Ford took a pass from the halves and sent the ball right over to his inside man who kept the leather going, by passing to Sathrang who in turn let drive, giving Fidoek no chance to save. At the kick-off Timmins did the same thing, only to be pulled up for off-side. Dunbar came down and passed over. Cooper getting the ball, took a drive. Fidoek made a nice save. The Dome now got going on their right and made a good run, but an accident happened to Hitt, putting him out of action for a time and so handicapping the Dome team. The Dome players failed to break up the Timmins combination attacks. Ford took another pass from his halves and carried the ball down and passed. The ball, being closely watched by Ewart, went to every foot of the forwards, to Dunbar on the right, who had clear right-of-way for a shot. Fidoek saved a well placed ball and sent his forwards away for a raid, only to find Halley and Hetherington in their path. Harrower placed another to his forwards but it was a weak kick and Street had no difficulty in saving. The Dome tried again to score, but Street kept his sheet clean.

Halley set his forwards going again and got in front of Fidoek, but Timmins let the ball go begging two feet in front of the goal, with two men anxious to score. Ewart saving, Sathrang passing over to Ford who took a shot, Fidoek saving, but made a weak clearance to Sathrang who drove the leather home on a first-time shot just before the whistle.

The second half started and finished in the rain. The Dome started the attack and combined by the backs only to shoot wide on an open goal. The ball was transferred to the other end, F. Cadman taking a pass from Dunbar and trying his shooting irons out. Fidoek saved. Sathrang and Peterson rushing Fidoek, Ewart came to his assistance by kicking the dropped ball clear. The Dome forwards again combined. Halley and Hetherington fooled them; Hetherington intercepting a pass and dribbling his way clear. Fidoek now had his work cut out for a while, but showed his skill with three shots in quick succession. Kellow got his men away on the right and Street fisted out a dangerous shot, with three men on him. Here the Dome had three corners awarded them, only to have Halley and Cooper clear them. Sathrang took a pass from Dunbar and tried a lone rush, beating his way through with tricky footwork, but Fidoek timed his kick well and saved. The whistle blew with the score standing two to nil.

The Timmins team have improved. Ford on the left and Dunbar with his passing have strengthened the team. Too much can not be said of the good work of Bell, Peterson and Sathrang. The three half-backs worked hard in helping their forwards on with their passing, while Halley and Hetherington let little by to show Street's good work. The Dome worked hard, but they are up against a stiff team in Timmins this season.
