## LANCASHIRE WON SECOND PLACE BY WIN THURSDAY

Interesting Football in Porcupine League Series Last Week.

Lancashire Football Club team went to second place in the Porcupine District Football League standing by defeating the Town Blues on Thursday last, the score being 3 to 2. There were over 500 present at the match.

The match started with the Town on the offensive but Jackson and Uttley kept the ball clear. The Lanes gave a spurt, only to have Fergy check them up. The Town again pressed but they failed to take advantage of the strong wind by passing the leather over. Instead they trusted to individual play, losing the ball to Wragg and Jackson. Again, the Lanes got their combination going but Cooper robbed them of the ball, and set his right going. Adamson missed a good chance by hanging on too long. Round saving by kicking out of touch. Fergy made a good attack, Uttley clearing to centre. Hodgins, Wright and McGee went up with Wragg following and gave Street one to handle. The Lanes were determined to get one in. D. Hodgins kicked the ball just past Roberts who left it to Street to clear, but Hodgins got by and scored. The White Shirts followed up their lead with another fine combination attack. Street saved, and in bouncing the ball by three opponents, Wright caught the bounce and sent in number two. The Town worked hard to break up the Lancashire combination and were bunching together in their efforts and failing to get in combination work themselves with the exception of Grantham and Adamson who were working together on the right and put in some close calls and were finally rewarded by Adamson's pass being sent in for a goal by Grantham. The Town opened up strong to even things, Cooper and Fergy keeping their forwards busy, but they could not get the leather between the posts. The Lanes again opened out only to have Roberts and Liddle take care of their rush. Half-time came with the score standing 2 to 1 in favour of the Lancastrians.

The second half started with better open play by the Town and the Lanes, going strong with their combination. It made nice play and kept the ball swinging. The Lancastrians were the first to attack on their right, Andy clearing, and the Town went up only to find the same opposition. For the first 15 minutes the ball was kept going from end to end. Fergy took the ball and ran up; taking a nice shot over the heads of the Lancastrians and just under the bar for a goal. This was one of the best shots this season. Both teams were pressing hard, but the ball was kept clear. The Town forgot the open play and started individual work again and let the Lanes in close quarters, Liddle having some hard work to keep them out and Street having lots to handle, but they kept the road clear. The Lanes came on again with increased energy, swinging the ball over to centre. Relief came when Hanna set Adamson going on a raid, but Jackson took care of him and sent the ball back again. There was a lively play for a while in the Town's territory when McGee and Hodgins broke through. Street ran out to clear. The ball was shot at goal. Singleton was waiting in the goal mouth and made sure it went in. This was the winning goal and caused much discussion. It may be mentioned that the point was covered by Secretary W. Field's article in The Advance last week. If the ball came off Street before Singleton, who was in an offside position, touched it, then Singleton was "on side" and the goal was correct. This was the position taken by the referee and he should know. On the other hand if Singleton got the ball from a pass from one of his own team then he was "offside," as Secretary Field explained last week. The referee's decision goes, and in this case was apparently all correct. Lancashires won 3 to 2.

## FARMERS' DAY AGAIN THIS YEAR AT IROQUOIS FALLS.

"Farmers' Day" last year at Iroquois Falls was a feature of importance, and plans are now under way to have this year's event even more helpful and interesting. The Broke Hustler, of Iroquois Falls, this week says:—

The annual Farmers' Day which was inaugurated last year is now being arranged for. The date has not been decided on but the farmers of the Monteith and Matheson district are now discussing the date and will notify the Board of Trade here what day would be suitable to them. It is probable that it will be about the middle of July.

At the last meeting of the Board of Trade it was left in the hands of the president to name a committee to make full arrangements for this visit which will be done this week. It will be remembered at the meeting last year there were some one hundred and thirty farmers and their wives here who unanimously voted to make the journey here an annual affair so that they might become quite familiar with how wood is turned into paper, with the needs of the people here both in the private houses and in the camps so that they might supply as far as possible the produce required by the town.

This year promises to be as big a success as last year or even greater.

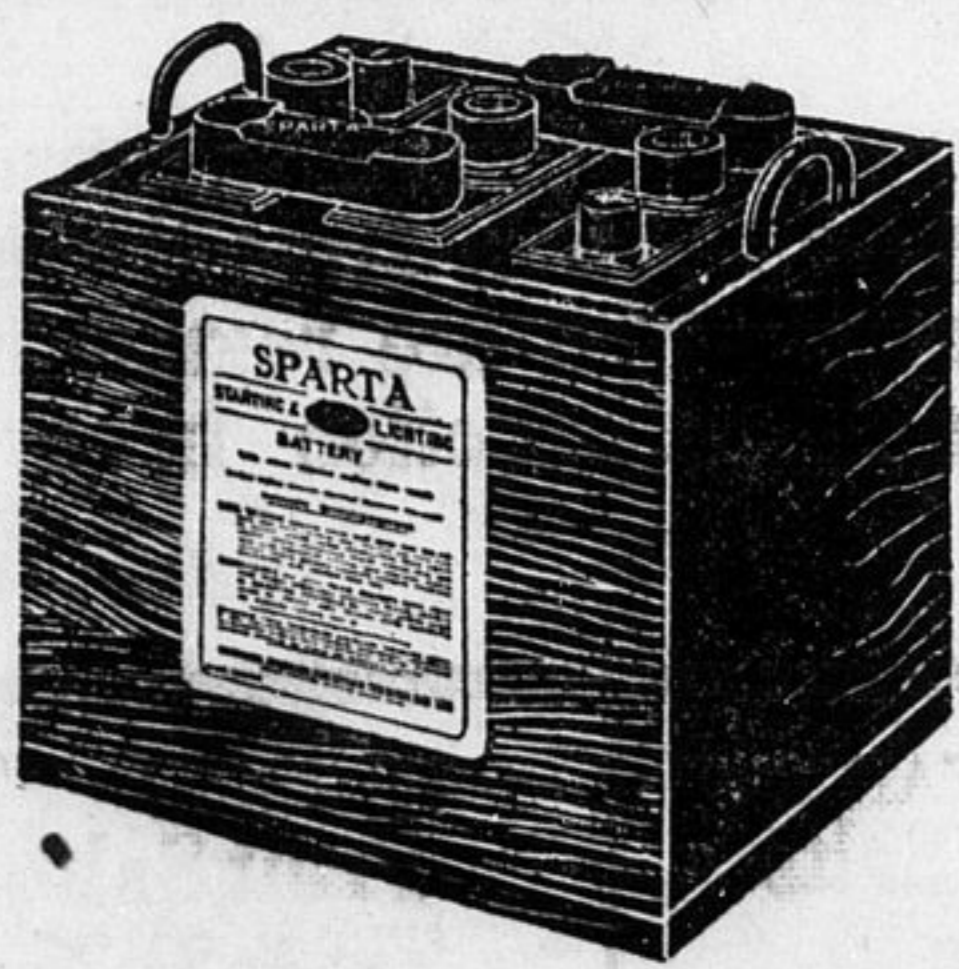
