Papermakers Win Opening Game in District Baseball

McCONNELL AND LEFTY HURLBERT IN A PITCHING DUEL. PARADE STARTED IN THE SEVENTH, FALLS SCORING FOUR RUNS ON ONE HIT.

The following detailed report of the opening game in District Baseball is from the capable pen of J. N. Levine, official scorer for many seasons in baseball in this district:—

Iroquois Falls started the 1924 season on the right side of the ledger on Wednesday last by defeating Timmins 5 to 1 on the new big league park at the Falls.

The Papermakers trotted out almost a complete new line-up. Cunningham at 3rd is a likely-looking ball player and handles himself very nicely. Lefty Hurlbert, like all Southpaws, is inclined to be erratic. He hit two batsmen and walked four, but tightened up in the pinches. Graham is a very ordinary back-stop with a poor wing.

Timmins appeared on the field with a makeshift line-up, and did very well, considering that such stars as Tate, Scully, Alexander, Douglas and Murphy could not get off from their work to play.

McConnell on the mound for the Miners did very well until the 7th when he weakened and walked Gratton and Bart., and two errors by Monaghan, followed by a single, enabled the Papermakers to score four runs.

McIntyre caught one of the best games of his career and his snap throw to second caught Gauthier cold, and he was run down between second and third. McIntyre also struck out once and walked five times.

McGrath came through with a hit which scored the only run for Timmins.

Abrams and Lewis handled everything which came their way, but failed miserably with the willow. Lynch beat out an infield hit, but the outfield is not his position. A place for him on the infield would be to the advantage of the team.
