Developments on the Way

However the scientists of the United States have succeeded in inducing their government to advance money for the development of helium from the natural gases of that country. Taking advantage of the work done in Canada, by Canadians, they commenced in 1919 to extract helium in large quantities from the gas of Texas. Recently a sum of three million dollars has been granted by the United States Government to further PROFESSOR JOHN CUNNING- this work.

It is probable that within the next few years wonderful uses will be found for this gas, aside from airship filling. It may greatly cheapen the transmission of electrical power and revolutionize modern ideas of illumination from electric lamps, as well as aiding in the development of many other fields of human effort.
