## Timmins Opens Baseball Season at Home With a Win

TATE HURLS A GOOD STEADY GAME. STRIKES OUT TWELVE OPPOSING BATSMEN. KNOCKS IN FOUR RUNS HIMSELF. MURPHY STEALS SECOND AND THIRD IN THE THIRD FRAME

The following is the report of last Wednesday's ball game as given by the official score keeper, Mr. J. N. Levine:—

With the old weather gent in the best of humor, Timmins ushered in the 1924 baseball season on the home lot with a win over their old-time rivals from Iroquois Falls, equally well-known, as the Papermakers or the Eskimos.

On Wednesday last, Timmins trotted out a very much improved ball club to what appeared at the league opening at Iroquois Falls.

Three old-time pioneers of the Gold Camp proceeded to take part in the opening ceremonies. His Worship the Mayor, Dr. McInnis, on the mound; Mr. J. P. McLaughlin, behind the plate; and Mr. C. G. Williams at bat.

With Murphy at 2nd and Tate and Scully on the line-up the Miners were a largely improved ball club. Tate's hitting was very noticeable and came along when hits meant runs.

Pierce and Scully worked the hit and run play to perfection in the 3rd frame, when Scully went all the way to 3rd on the hit.

McIntyre was as reliable as usual and the opposing base runners took no liberties when on the bags. Abrams looked after everything his way in nice style and went all the way to 3rd on a single, only as Jack Keefe knows how.

Graham, behind the plate for the Papermakers was hurt in the 1st frame and was replaced by Gratton. The latter also grabbed off two triples and a single. Cunningham was used only in the closing stages of the game as the morning sight seeing of Timmins must have had some effect on him.
