

**HOLLINGER WINS IN FIRST MATCH WITH LANCASHIRES**

The Hollinger and Lancashire teams clashed for the first time this season on Thursday last, the Hollinger coming out on top in the fray to the score of 8 to 1. D. Hodgins got the lone score for the Lancashires, and for the Hollinger Peterson got two,

Berg and Halley one each, Sathrang three and Jackson one on his own. The play was about 15 minutes old when Berg sent the ball over to Dunbar who headed it back to Peterson, the latter scoring on a high shot. The Norwegians were playing a nice tricky match. Sistrern gave Ford a pass. Ford sent it to Berg, who in turn put it in front of the goal mouth for

Sathrang to tip in for number two. The Lanes. could not get out of their quarters, for Warne, Sistrern and Stephenson kept them back, feeding their own forwards in great style, the Lanes. not being able to get in their combination work. Berg was the next to score by beating the backs and shot low. The play went to mid-field for a while until Sistrern sent the ball to Dunbar who centered. Sathrang scored from close in, giving Hunt no chance. Sathrang again shot, Hunt saving a hot drive, the ball going back to Sathrang who scored before Hunt could recover his place in goal. The Lancastrians were working hard now to keep back the offensive of the Hollinger. After working a nice combination on their left, they were able to come close in and give Dedrickson a low one to clear. This was followed by two more shots, but they were unable to score before the referee blew his whistle for half-time.

The second half started with the Lanes. opening out their play and after five minutes D. Hodgins worked his way through for their only goal. The Hollinger let loose only to have Uttley clear. The Lanes. went up, but Dedrickson saved. Hodgins missed a good chance right after by shooting wide of an open goal. The Hollinger came down again and were awarded a free kick, and scored. The Hollinger now set the pace again, working the ball from left to right, and got another goal from a pass, Berg to Peterson, in front of the goal. The Lanes. went away again and gave Dedrickson another one to handle. The Lanes. had a little of the play now, but were kept out by Hetherington and Halley and were not able to score. The play was again transferred to the other end, but the ball was kept clear, Hunt doing fine work with the long shots, while Uttley and Jackson kept out the rushes. The Hollinger kept up the pace and were awarded another goal when Jackson headed through his own goal in trying to clear. This finished the scoring, the final count being 8 to 1 in favour of the Hollinger.

**JUDGE DISPOSES OF FOUR CASES IN 15 MINUTES**

The big suit over pulpwood between the Porcupine Pulp & Lumber Co., and the St. Maurice Lumber Co. was traversed until October. Another case was transferred to the District Judge. Another case was adjourned until autumn on account of a bereavement in the family of the defendant. The fourth case was ordered dismissed.

**CROWN ATTORNEY GREER BROKE LEG LAST WEEK**

Last week while playing ball, Mr. J. M. Greer, Crown Attorney for Cochrane District, had the misfortune to break his leg. He is at his home at Cochrane and is making excellent progress to recovery from the injury.

On account of the injury to the Crown Attorney, the perjury case scheduled for this week has been adjourned until Saturday. This case arose from evidence given at the recent session of court at Cochrane in the case of the men and a woman formerly occupying the Queen's Cafe building at Timmins who were charged with unlawfully detaining a woman by force and holding her for immoral purposes. One of the witnesses at Cochrane swore that his previous story under oath had been all wrong. He was at once charged with perjury, it being evident that one or other of his stories must be untrue and detrimental to the cause of justice. Recently he asked for a speedy trial and the case was to come before Judge Caron on Monday but on account of the Crown Attorney being laid up with a broken leg the case has been adjourned to Saturday of this week. Chief Greer was on his way from Timmins on Sunday to attend the trial as a witness, but at Porquis Junction Chief Greer received word that on account of the injury to Crown Attorney Greer the case would not be proceeded with at present. Accordingly Chief Greer returned on the evening train. He will go to Cochrane Friday for the case.
