\$1000 OFFERED FOR CROWN LANDS AGENT, DEAD OR ALIVE

It is understood that a reward of \$1000.00 has been offered for the production of the body, dead or alive, of J. L. O'Donnell, former Crown Lands Agent at Hearst. While out on bail awaiting trial on a charge of theft from the Government, O'Donnell is said to have left on a trip down the Pagwa River. His companions on the trip returned and reported that O'Donnell had apparently gone insane and taken to the bush and they had

been unable to locate him again. Search parties made earnest effort to locate the missing man but up to date without success.
