Commenting on the Sgures the Post says:-"The foregoing crop Pgures for 1923, issued by Mr. W. B. Way, Superintendent of the Cochrane Division of the C.N.R., once more demonstrate that the Northern Clay Belt is beyond the experimental stage and that the agricultural development is progressing at the ratio of the influx of settlers. A great deal has yet to be accomplished, through a more intensive and aggressive colonization policy, before the aggregate of the crop yields will influence to any appreciable extent the whole production of the Dominion, but if the advance at present is slow, it nevertheless shows a steady movement.

"These figures should therefore not be considered in the aggregate of present production of the clay belt so much as in the demonstration of th potentialities, provided the stream of immigration of adaptable settlers could

be directed to these lands.

"The near proximity of the world's markets, both for export and for home consumption, of the agricultural products of the clay belt, which will grow anything that can be grown in the far western prairie lands, should furnish a great inducement for settlers to locate here and should ensure a fair proportion of diversion of immigration, provided the right steps are taken to impress upon the intending settlers that the clay belt is unsurpassed for farm lands."
