## Papermakers Won From the Miners at Falls Wednesday

HURLBERT AND MCCONNELL IN A PITCHING DUEL. PAPERMAKERS PLAY ERRORLESS BALL THROUGHOUT, WHILE MCCONNELL'S SUPPORT IN THE FOURTH WAS RAGGED. SCORE 2-1 IN FAVOUR OF FALLS.

Had McConnell received perfect support in his game at the Falls on Wednesday last, he, in all probability, would have had a no-hit, no-run game to his credit, and three or four of the Miners took a hand in throwing the game away.

The Miners started out minus the services of Scully and Tait and as a result, the club was considerably weakened. The hitting of these two was sorely missed, and to make matters worse McLean had a sore hand and the infield had to be switched around considerably.

The Miners scored their only run in the 3rd frame on a walk to Monaghan and singles by Lynch and McLean. Murphy was the only Miner to get even the semblance of a hit from Hurlbert in the remaining five frames. Murphy stole 2nd and 3rd in the 7th frame. Pierce saved Monaghan an error in the 1st innings on a very nice pick-up of a low throw, but failed with the stick.

Monaghan accepted six hard chances and only fozzled one, and that error allowed Coons to score with the winning run. McIntyre paved the way for Cunningham to score with the tying run when he threw the ball into centre field.
